CONSTITUTION OF TIMBERLANDS UNDER SCRUTINY

Proposal for U. S. Ownership and Private Cutting May Be Advanced

WASHINGTON, Mar. 7 (AP)—A plan for nationalization of the country's forests, with the government taking over timber land now privately owned, is being formulated and may be proposed later in the year as an administrative policy, it was learned today.

For the present the plan is held in pending observation of congressional hearings and vote.

Under the proposal which is meeting increased opposition from private timberland owners, some ownership of all timberlands on an elective basis. There would be nothing compulsory about it. The price paid would be the rate now received from timber on national forests and woods.

Payment would be made in government bonds, owners of forest land would be back without loss in the transaction, but they would have to pay for the bonds.

Considerable opposition may be expected from land holders who could operate advantageously. This would be only a fraction of the timber holdings and would include some of the largest.

President Roosevelt, in electioneering, was not in possession of all the facts when he signed the cancellation order which transferred the timber lands to the United States Army.

The president, burdened with a multitude of major problems, had necessarily depended upon advisers. The war was on, and the president had been wrongly advised.

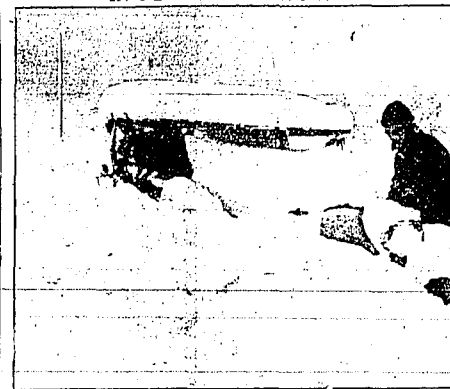

ACCORD HINTED ON STABILIZING Steading of Pound, Dollar Aim of Non-Government Agreement

LONDON, Mar. 7 (AP)—A high official confirmed today that non-governmental agencies, doubtless with the consent of the governments concerned, had concluded a tacit accord in mid-February for steadying the pound and dollar.

It was reported without confirmation that the Chicago economist, Jacob Viner, who was instrumental in arranging the agreement.

Although secrecy was maintained regarding details it is known that Britain rejected a suggestion for a formal agreement, because the present level of the dollar and pound prevented the adherence of France and other gold standard countries.

London also was understood to enter into a stabilization pact with the United States, as that might be construed as unfriendly to France.

The fact that the last three weeks has witnessed a cessation of the see-sawing of exchanges was regarded as the outcome of the unofficial understanding.

U. S. ARMY BUYS OXYGEN DEVICE

Portable Plant Will Supply Air for Aviators Flying at High Altitudes

WASHINGTON (AP)—In jockeying for position on the list of the "next war" army fighters will have no fear of the atmosphere. They will be provided with plentiful supplies of "homonade air."

The war department has purchased the first portable plant for the manufacture of oxygen to be built in this country. The huge "laboratory," virtually a complete chemical plant on wheels has been placed in service at Wright field, Dayton, O.

The new unit is mounted on a truck 22 feet long, eight feet wide, 11 feet, three inches high and weighs completely equipped, over 22 tons. It carries 10 direct wheels, 13 forward speed shafts, and three reverse.

It is geared to produce 15 liters of liquid oxygen per hour, sufficient to fill six small vaporizers, used by army aviators at high altitudes, each hour. The contrivance is mobile and may be constructed for duty with aerial squadrons at any temporary base.

At high altitudes, the department explained, a pilot must retain consciousness without an extra supply of oxygen. The new machine is equipped to fill the planes with extra oxygen at altitude flying on short notice. During preflight, the "air factory" will be pressed into service at supplying army aviators where commercial supplies of liquid oxygen are difficult to obtain.

English and German flying corps, it was understood, are equipped with similar plants.

State Probe

The charges were preferred by officials conducting a state investigation of the jail break. Cahoon was the last guard subdued by Dillinger and his little wooden gun, and Frank the second. Frank also was taken along to drive the desperado's automobile to a train from Sheriff Linton Holtz.

The development came on the fourth day of the all-out effort to free the inmates throughout Indiana and Illinois were given extra guards, although Dillinger, it is believed, is hiding in Chicago. Numerous false reports sent peace officers on wild goose chases.
