FRENCH STAR'S LOSER ON UPSET

Defeat Hinted as "Trail's End" for Basque's Big Time Career

NEW YORK, Mar. 14 (AP)—Jean Borotra's hopes of fighting back the "big-time" tennis star, who has been blasted like the great for the fifth national indoor tennis title.

As the tourney continues today on the pine courts of the seventh Regiment armory, with seven Americans and one lone Frenchman competing in the quarter-finals, the second round match of Borotra vs. Basque was the highlight of the day.

The Great Borotra, for years one of the musketeers of the defending French Davis cup team, became a "winner" in the international tennis-trail yesterday in the opinion of many experts. He won the match in five sets, 8-6, 6-3, 6-4, 6-2, 6-3. Borotra turned him back 2-6, 10-8, 9-7. This defeat had the appearance of a "comeback" because he had been beaten, but it was an appalling indoor. For years Borotra has been considered the ace of the world's indoor players.

Moreover, the elimination follows a questionable win in the first and second rounds yesterday. Jean had difficulty with Kenneth Alcock and was in distress against Ernest Kene.

Cites Knee Injury

When questioned after the match Borotra gave an indication that he might retire, now he has the feeling that his plans for the remainder of the tourney are ruined by his poor performance. He attributed his poor performance to the recurrence of an old knee injury.

Young Andre Merin in the role of a "standard bearer" of the "white" in the tourney, was the only one of the white players who was able to advance yesterday. Eugene McQuinn of New York, and Christian Boushka was eliminated by George Lutz of Chicago.

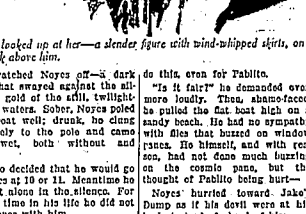

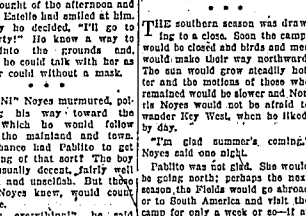

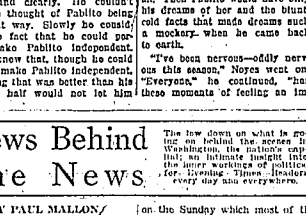
