

School authorities in several sections, taking cog-nizance of the fear that had been spread among the people, acted wisely, perhaps, in dismissing classes for a time.

The Evening Times, connected directly with the United Press bureau in Salt Lake City was in ideal position to know every development the instant it occurred. When-publication of the facts was made, and it was discovered that conditions were only slightly different than normal, there was satisfac-tion and confidence generated—the kind which brings order out of chaos.


