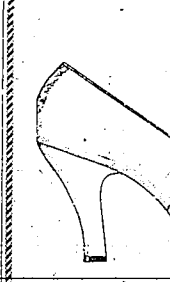

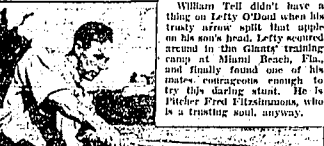

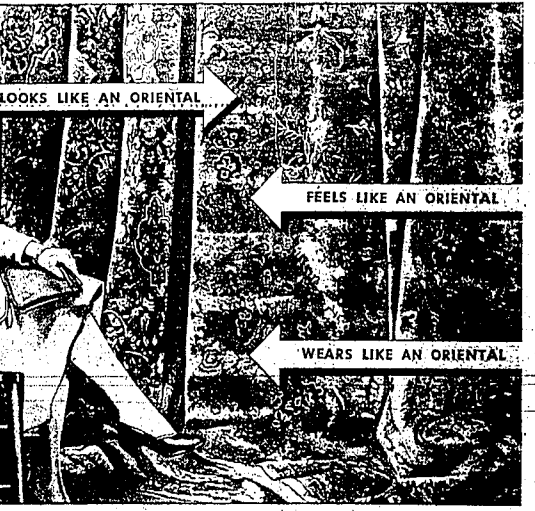

### BAG TAX DAPPED IN SESSION HERE

#### Resolution Urges Removal of Two-Cent Levy, Termined Burden to Grower

Resolution calling for the lifting of the present federal tax which imposes an average cost of two cents each on potato bags, introduced at a meeting here of growers and shippers from this section of the state.

The session was conducted in the high school auditorium last evening and was addressed by Austin Knox, secretary of the Southern Idaho Shippers' Traffic Bureau.

Next speaker was the secretary of the tax impose on Idaho shippers, J. N. Pettygrove, Hansen, president, John Brooking, Idaho, was secretary of the meeting.

Copies to Congress  
Copies of the resolution will be forwarded to members of Idaho's congressional delegation, to give support in the effort now being made to repeal the tax.

The resolution follows:  
Whereas, the U. S. government on December 9, 1925, imposed a processing tax upon all jute bags used in the U. S. as containers of potatoes, onions and beans ranging in amount from \$15.65 to \$22.04 per thousand, thereby placing an unjust, unfair and unreasonable burden upon the farming interests of the state of Idaho, costing them \$100,000.00, and which will, if continued, cost them approximately \$275,000 per annum.

Harms Growers  
Whereas, without any notice or hearing whatever, the government imposed upon jute products to the serious detriment of both the grower and shipper of beans, onions and potatoes, and

Whereas, the farmers of Idaho are today paying the heaviest freight rates upon their commodities moving to market of any like farming commodity in the U. S., and

Whereas, the farmers of Idaho have never used cotton bags, and it is in their interest to market their products and cannot use cotton bags in any quantity except for small commercial quantities and on which jute bags cannot be used, and

No Competitive  
Whereas, jute bags are in no way competitive to cotton as the ordinary containers for potatoes, onions and beans, and

Whereas, the farmers of Idaho are today paying the heaviest freight rates upon their commodities moving to market of any like farming commodity in the U. S., and

Whereas, the farm commodities of the state of Idaho during the past few years have sold at prices averaging less than the cost of production, particularly of crops which are affected by the tax on jute products, and

No Benefits  
Whereas, there is no direct nor indirect benefit received by the farmers of Idaho from the money that they have paid out as a result of this processing tax, and

Whereas, the potato, onion or bean industries have never received any crop advances or advances for abandoned acreage nor do they anticipate any such assistance, and

Whereas, the tax upon jute products is only another unjust, unfair and unreasonable burden added to those now being borne by the farmers of the state of Idaho, and further deprives them of any opportunity that they might have to recover from the depressed condition of their industry, now

The Farmers  
Therefore, be it resolved, that we, as growers and shippers in a meeting assembled at Twin Falls, Idaho, this fourteenth day of March, 1932, representing all farmers and shippers in this section of the Snake river valley, comprising practically the entire agricultural section of the state of Idaho, protest the processing tax now imposed upon jute bags used in marketing of our potatoes, and respectfully urge the U. S. government through the U. S. department of agriculture, to give the producers of potatoes, onions and beans relief from these unfair, unjust and unreasonable taxes, by removing the processing tax upon all bags used in the marketing of these commodities.

### Woman Tells of House Shaking From Temblor

A graphic account of the effect of Monday's earth tremors as it affected the area in the remote southwest corner of this county, is contained in a letter received by the Evening Times from one of its subscribers, Mrs. Joe Caudle, Rugersan.

Two years ago Mrs. Caudle reported to this newspaper the effect of the quake that centered in Nevada. In the belief that her description is important in any study that is made as to the extent of the shock in this region, her letter is printed here:

"As we have just felt an earthquake I am wondering where the center of this quake was.

"At five minutes past eight the family was sitting around the breakfast table, when all at once the house began to creak and pop for some little time before we could feel the rocking and quivering of the house. This kept getting worse until we were on the verge of leaving the house, when it ceased a little then came harder, then we were ready to leave when it ceased off and gradually came to a stop.

Second Shock  
"Every one got quivering and listening, when five minutes later we felt the second shock and heard a mild tapping about the breakfast table, when all at once the house which sounded like the floor lumping on the props underneath.

"Two years ago I wrote you that we felt the earthquake that centered in Nevada on Dec. 20, 1929, and that we were located 60 miles southwest of Twin Falls.

P. S. 10:30—Another mild shock has occurred, which resulted in the house and also caused it to quiver.

"11:20 another shock equal in the one felt at 8:05 this morning, except the duration of time being shorter.

"From the time we felt the first shock this morning up until sometime between 11:30 and noon it seems to me there were more or less continuous movements of the earth."

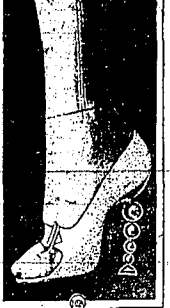
