

HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION-

MIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Now that the CWA is to be discontinued the first of the month, authorities who have in charge the letting of contracts for public works administration, federal and state highway projects should let no grass grow-under their feet.

Idaho, this newspaper has been authoritatively advised, is behind in its PWA program, and in addition numerous federal and state projects have not been pushed. It is granted that no one knew that the winter would be open and permit of continuous work, but now that spring is upon us every effort should be made to get needed construction understands.

In this particular district there are several road projects already on the program, One is the Twin-Falls loop, running south and west to Godwin siding. On the north side there are similar projects which are deserving of attention.

Through much effort, approval has been secured for the construction of a market road feading from Hansen bridge to a juncture on the Eden-Jerome highway, known as Knot's corrier. It is to be hoped that residents of that section will arree upon the that residents of that section will agree upon the most feasible route, if this has not already been done, so as to permit of early construction of a good

done, so as to permit of early construction of a good road to the bridge.

A 12-mile segment of the northside highway, from Knoll's corner, which is west of Eden, extending to Hazelton and beyond, as far as Greenwood school house on the way to Paul, remains unfinished. Residents of that section have every argument in the world for insisting upon the completion of this stretch, for certainly the road is as important as any

other segment in this part of the state.

(Although southern Idaho is getting well supplied with roads, the fact remains every new mile of good road increases property values, and makes life more desirable for the benefitted sections. No. one district can logically begandee another district from getting any such improvement, it/it is at all practical and justified, as is the Eden-Hazelton seg-

ment.

And in addition to this, the necessity for providing labor and public construction as an aid to national recovery should give encouragement to promotion of road building programs, and that might soon, for the acute unemployment period will doubtlessly continue this summer and fall.
