**REDUCED COUNTY COSTS**

Constant and consistent reduction in the operating costs of county offices, as revealed by the audit of the books reported by a certified public accountant, reflects credit on the administration.

Expenses in 1932 were 28 per cent less than in 1931, the report points out, and in 1933 they were 14 per cent under those of 1932.

Every office in the court house shared in the decline, bringing the total costs from \$199,643 in 1931, to \$143,911 in 1932, and to \$124,066 in 1933. It is important that this ratio be continued, or at least maintained, for the people are not yet ready to foot mounting tax costs. It is going to take several years to "catch up," regardless of how fast good times come.

**GOOD-OUT OF EVIL**

One of the strange developments of the year seems to be the way in which our old hogan-man, the Demon Rum, has appeared in the unfamiliar guise of friend and protector of the poor.

This is happening in the Virgin Islands. The colonial council there has drawn up plans for making the rum industry a public monopoly to rehabilitate the economic life of the islands.

A public corporation is to be formed — if this plan is adopted — to handle the manufacture of a potential maximum of from 3,000,000 to 1,000,000 gallons of rum annually. Profits will go to social and public welfare work.

As part of the program, some thousands of natives will be established on five and ten-acre homestead tracts to produce the sugar cane from which the rum is made.
