DISCRIMINATION

Freight rate injustices long endured by this sec-tion have their counterpart in the tariffs assessed by the truck lines.

the truck lines.

Idaho has a public utilities commission which is presumed to examine charges and regulare carriers. Here is something which will bear the close attention of the utilities body:

The truck line rate on canned goods from here to Idaho Falls is 75 cents a hundred pounds. From Salt Lake City to Idaho Falls, the rate is only 68 cents a hundred, but the distance is 63 miles less.

One local manufacturer finds this sort of a charge contribing difficult to explain to be superport in the

One local manufacturer finds this sort of a charge something difficult to explain to his customers in the upper river, country, and in addition makes Utah competition doubly hard.

If What, about the rates to Salt Lake City? Again there is gross discrimination. The following sounds thibelievable; but is vouched for by one in the truck business:

To ship, vegetables from Salt Lake City to Twin Falls will cost 70 cents a hundred pounds; but to reverse the isituation and ship them from Twin Falls to Salt Lake City, the charge is not 70 cents but 94 CENTS A HUNDRED POUNDS!

Potatoes may be shipped in from Salt Lake City for 60 cents a hundred. To ship them to the Utah metropolis the rate is 80 cents, Fresh fruit will be transported here from Salt Lake for 85 cents; but when sent from here to that city, the charge is \$1.11 adundred.

The instances cited are only samples of the sort of discrimination suffered by this state. There are many others. Perhaps this calling of attention to sten rank injustices will result in some good to the

producers of this area.

Heaven knows this section pays high enough fleight rates on commodities shipped in. Must it also continue-to-be-penalized-on-the cost of shipping its products to consuming centers but a few hundred miles away.

INSULL

l'Samuel Insull seems to have taken on most of the aspects of a will-o'the-wisp. On this side of the Atlantic, black headlines 'tell' the latest news of his wanderings; on the other side he filts about the borders homeless and restless, a fugitive harried by some compulsion whose roots go deeply into subsoil of the land that he has disowned.

Consider what he had a few years ago. He was rich beyond dreams and powerful beyond any man's need. He was an industrialist, a financier, a patron

need. He was an industriants, a infancier, a patron
of the arts.
If an ambitious broker's clerk had dreamed a
wildly extravagant dream of worldly greatness, it
would have not come up to the reality-which was
Samuel Insull's.
Everything that cleverness and acquisitiveness and

rathless energy could get for a man, in a land where those qualities were allowed to function unchecked, he had won.

those qualities were allowed to function unchecked, he had won.

All this he had, and all of it has dissolved like the mists of yesterday morning. His principality has shruhk to a rusty Greek freight steamer; his dominion extends to her bridge, but no farther.

The ship wallows across the eastern seas bound for Abyssinia, or for Persia, or perhaps for Somalliand—it does not matter, for Insull really is hunting a port not to be found on any chart, a place of refuge that this life with its imperfections, never will open to him again.

Lit makes, indeed, very little difference whether the man ever actually is collared and brought back to America. He carries his own punishment with him; an unquiet shade that must stand eternally at his elbow and remind him of the kingdom that he lost, the reputation that he destroyed.

How can a man run away from a thing like that? Insull cannot; no man can. He can dodge from one out-of-the-way scaport to another to the end of time. It does not matter. Retribution caught up with him a long time ago.

Settlement of the threatened industrial strikes in the east must be rated as a distinct achievement for President Roosevelt and the administration. Southern Idaho would be among the first to suffer directly from a large strike on account of curtailed consuming power for such commodities as potatoes, beans, wheat and sugar, principal products of this section.




