

THE CONGRESSIONAL ACTION

Passage by the House and the Senate, over the Presidential veto, of the bill providing bigger allowances for veterans and more pay for federal workers is understandable. This, it must be remembered, is election year.

This, it must be remembered, is election year. It cannot be said, justifiably, that congressmen over-rode the veto secure in the knowledge that the Senate would sustain it, for that was no more assured than was the House action, which authorities predicted would be just the reverse of what it was. -But congressmen, who have taken the criticism of veterans for their action in passing the Economy act a year ago, could point to a vote in favor of liberalized compensation, regardless of the outcome of the measure at the hands of the Senate.

The President, too, is in the clear, for he exhausted his efforts to defeat the measure in a lengthy veto message.

ed his efforts to defeat the measure in a rengery message.

When the buck was passed to the Senate that body was faced with getting all the blame if it sustained the President, and sharing only a part of the credit if the veto was over-ridden.

Its vote late yesterday, must be considered more audacious, then, than that of the House, for several reasons.

addictors, then, than that of the House, for several reasons.

The Senate is not as amenable to popular will as is the House, and only a fraction of its membership must stand for re-election this fall. In contrast, every member of the House is a patential candidate and must now be alert to building his political fences.

There is no particular criticism to be directed at the Congress in failing to sustain the President, unless it be in the matter of increasing the pay of government employees. Some of them, doubtlessly, have been underpaid, but not all, especially those in the higher income. brackets. There will be popular support for the more liberalized provisions for veterans. Spanish war veterans, especially, have been called upon to suffer a heavy cut in compensation, which will be overcome, to some extent at least, as the result of the bill becoming law.

POLITICS VS. ECONOMICS

If present tendencies continue, the whole face of American politics is likely to be changed almost be-

American politics is likely to be changed almost beyond recognition.

This change is not simply a matter of a new alignment of the two national parties. It will be concerned, rather, with the mechanics of government, especially of local government, our conception of the duty, which an officeholder owes to the public, as contrasted with his duty to his party, may at least be brought up to date.

You can get an understanding of what the change may be like by considering a proposal recently advanced for a series of state factories in North Dakota.

wanced for a series of state factories in North Dakota.

This scheme has been propounded by Senator Lynn Frazier, Republican, and A. C. Townley, organizer of the Nonpartisan League. Under it, the North Dakota Industrial Commission has asked the PWA for a loan of \$4,000,000 to finance a chain of state factories—75 of them; in all—to make woolen cloth, clothing, shoes, linseed oil, flour and so on The idea is that these factories would provide work for the state's unemployed, help supplement the income of farmers, and turn the state's raw materials into manufactured articles. Leave aside, for the moment, the question of whether such an experiment in Socialism is wise, and consider what pressure the scheme would put on the traditional politics-ridden government of the average American state.

It is reported at Washington, for instance, that PWA officials will not consider making the loan unless they are convinced that there will be efficient and rigidly honest administration within the state. And it also is recalled that officials of the CWA recently ousled Gov. William Langer of North Dakota as state CWA administrator because of alleged political collections from CWA workers.

A stunt of this kind, in other words, simply would not work at all unless the state government were run with far more sense of public responsibility, and far less thought for political advantage, than we find nowadays in the ordinary state government.

And if such proposals, are to become part of our scheme of things—as, according to present indications, they may—it becomes vitally necessary for us to make our system of politics ready for them.
