IDAHO RESIDENTS PAY MORE TAXES

Federal Income Levy Secures Increased Returns from State's Citizens

BOISE, Mar. 29 (UP)—Residents of Idaho this year have paid more than four times as much in the federal treasury in income taxes as they did in 1933.

As a result, it is important, said the tax in a lump sum rather than by the installment plan which has been the popular method for the last several years.

Office assistants of John R. Wiley, internal revenue collector, report that at all of optimism, almost a million more dollars are collected by the throngs that crowded their office up to the very last minute of the installment year could be made without penalty.

Confidence of still better times ahead and greater business improvement, like last year has brought, were most apparent in the 1934 installment payments that passed across the counters as the taxpayers made their statements.

The collector's office remained open until midnight on March 15, which is the "deadline" for 1934 returns. Returns came in thick and fast on the last few days, so fast, in fact, that the office was swamped with them. It required two days of continuous work to classify the returns and add up the totals.

"I wish to enter a protest against the use of CWA funds for a campaign of extermination of jackrabbits in Idaho," Van Name, a member of the American Museum of Natural History, wrote.

"It does not appear that rabbits are troublesome enough there to induce people to take any measures to get rid of them at their own expense and the taxpayers of New York and other states in the East should not be called upon to do it for them.

The Idaho scheme seems, from newspaper items, to consist of two parts—first, a big anti-rabbit drive largely for the amusement of local people, at public expense; and second, a poisoning campaign, which will certainly result in the wholesale destruction of the valuable and beneficial wild creatures as well, probably of some that are claimed to be food.

The broadest scattering of poison is detectable and inexcusable business which the federal government would do far better to prohibit than to engage in.
