

# GREECE DEMANDS TURKEY RELEASE INSULL'S VESSEL

Athens Foreign Minister Says International Law Bans Present Detention

## INDEMNITY PLEA HINTED

Captain of Maltas Ordered to Offer Armed Fight Against Seizure

MONTE CARLO, Mar. 31 (UP)—Prince Louis of Monaco has offered Samuel Insull, fugitive Chicago utilities czar, an asylum in his gambling principality, it was learned today.

Insull is reported as hesitant about accepting the offer, because the principality has an extradition treaty with the United States.

Monaco, furthermore, already has used the United States for recovery on defaulted bonds of the Confederate States of America, which it has never collected. Insull, according to the Monte Carlo, is afraid the prince may use the offer to barter for payment on the bonds.

ATHENS, Mar. 31 (UP)—Foreign Minister Metaxas today called the Turkish government at Ankara, demanding release under international law of the Greek steamship Maltas, which has Samuel Insull aboard as passenger.

Turkish authorities have held the ship since Thursday, seeking a way to extradite Insull to answer charges of fraud in the United States.

Maximos demand was made up of a representation of Greece's chief counsel here for the Chicago utilities czar. Pop also regarded the Maltas as a vessel of the United States, and Insull as a passenger.

Insull Indemnity—Pop called the master of the Maltas to refuse to surrender Insull, who he demanded him, and asked for indemnity for Maltas' detention, which he holds to be without warrant under international law.

Pop ordered the master of the Maltas to offer Insull resistance if necessary, to prevent Insull's seizure.

# U. S. PILOT DIES IN CRASH

Army Flier Falls to Death in Heavy Rainstorm Over Iowa Farmland

DEWITT, Ia., Mar. 31 (UP)—Lieut. Thurman A. Wood, army flier, crashed to death last night in a few minutes after the engine of his plane stalled in a heavy rainstorm over Iowa farmland.

Wood's death was the first since the army resumed aerial service following a period of suspension following the crash of a biplane at the same place last year.

A heavy rainstorm, of which the crash was the first, was blamed for the crash. The nose of the plane was found to be headed south and the engine stalled four feet into the ground. The 23 mail sacks, weighing 500 pounds, were scattered. Wood had turned off his ignition switch before the crash and there had been no fire.

# Colorful Rites Mark Easter In Varied Sections of World

## Yaqui Indians Stage Annual Pageantry of Dance

YACUILLAGE OF CHIHUAHUA, Ariz., Mar. 31 (UP)—With the swords of Spanish conquistadors and the tresses of Spanish padenas centuries ago brought Christianity to Arizona, Yaqui Indians today prepared for the strangest Easter rites in America.

The Yaqui ceremony depicts the suffering and death of Christ. The tradition is handed down from tribal customs remembered by the old chiefs. They were taught by Spanish padres of the southwest during the early days. It is a combination of Christian rites mingled with the ancient Indian beliefs.

## Ab-Night Dance

When the sun dips behind the western hills, a sunset-to-dawn dance will start here. A campfire will be lighted in a great circle with the women and children gather with their candles. Every able bodied bared, stripped to the waist, and wearing a grotesque "paint of worship," will start the dance.

## Stomp on Spirits

They stop their gyrations at times to stomp on imaginary objects or strike the air with great bare white hands in a symbolic movement to kill evil spirits. The dance is around a small glass case containing a statue of Christ, which, according to their beliefs, they are protecting from evil spirits.

## Chiefs of the various tribes have sent out the word that spectators are not wanted this year. They have commercialized the rites to such an extent that the red men object to the Christian onlookers.

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# CWA PLANNED PROGRAM BEGINS

Experiment in Mass Relief Reaches Final Aiding Millions

COST TOTALLED BILLION

Smaller Federal Work Policy Also Designed on Job Creating Lines

WASHINGTON, Mar. 31 (UP)—The administration today announced a program which cost \$1,000,000,000 and gave work to 4,000,000 people during the next year. The program is to be an end to the unemployment problem, 2,000,000 persons still on the payroll.

With the ending of the CWA, the government's greatest experiment in mass employment relief, Relief Administration today announced that all those still receiving aid would be transferred automatically to an end to the unemployment problem, 2,000,000 persons still on the payroll.

New Policy Monday

The new federal relief policy began operation Monday. It is planned to operate on a continuing basis, less expensive and to provide the framework of a permanent relief program.






