





STEPHAN A CANDIDATE

Entry of Frank L. Stephan in the campaign for Entry of Frank L. Stephan in the campaign for governor has the effect of centering inuch of the interest in the impending political race in this county. It must not be forgotten that Twin Falls is also the home of the Republican state chairman, R. P. Larry, and this city and county as a Democratic hot-hed has already been commented upon in these columns. Regarding Stephan, it is quite generally conceeded that he can win the Republican nomination for governor. As a former attorney general he bears a favoriable statewide acquaintance, and his opposition in the August primaries promises to be light. In Mr. Stephan, the Republican party will have as strong a candidate as it could muster, perhaps. Speculation as to his chances in the November election is futile, especially since his nomination is

Speculation as to his chances in the November election is futile, especially since his nomination is not yet a reality, and his opponent yill be unknown until after the primaries.

One thing certain, if he wins the nomination, it will be the first time Twin Falls ever enjoyed such a distinction, for to date the only recognition it ever received in the statehouse at the hands of the electorate of Idaho, are two attorneys-general (Stephan and Gillis) and the present state auditor (Harry C. Parsons.)

JAPAN'S THREAT OVER CHINA

The picture of international politics in the Far East has undergone a considerable change through Japan's most recent statement of her policy toward

China.

Or, possibly, it would be more accurate to say that while the picture remains much the same, it has an entirely different frame.

Japan sets forth the proposition that sae holds a special responsibility to maintain the peace in east. Asia; consequently, Japan has appointed herself to see to it that China's contacts with other powers are of such nature that they shall not disturb that peace. For several years Japan has been edging toward it Chinese protectorate. With this new declaration of policy, that state stems practically to have been reached.

policy can be interpreted.

A good many Americans are engaged in giving technical or financial aid to China right now. Many American aviators are there, for instance, selling airplanes and teaching the Chinese how to use them.

American companies are participating in the establishment of Chinese air routes. The United States

tablishment of Chinese air routes. The United States government has loaned money to China to buy American cotton and wheat.

All these activities could easily be classed as the kind of aid which might become political; that is, they tend to unify and strengthen China, and the zealous statesmen at Tokio might decide at any minute that they should be stopped.

One does not have to meditate over this very long to see that the Far Eastern situation has taken on an ominous new aspect. The one encouraging feature is that in recent months the Japanese seem to have grown desirous of getting on better terms with the United States.

We can only hope that that desire will lead Tokio to moderate the application of this far-reaching and dangerous new policy.
