OLD DEALERS VS. NEW DEALERS

With an election impending in Idaho which involves only congressional, state and county offices, criticism of the Democratic party, as revealed at the Republican meeting here Saturday, is going to center upon the national administration which is in office until 1937 at the very least.

It is to be expected that the campaign, local as it is in scope, will develop some strong arguments, for it is not to be presumed that the present minority party is going to permit an election to come and go without putting up a fight. While spokesmen for the outs rave at what they call regimentation, intellectuals and dictators, they would tell the voters forget that while the country was in the throes of panic previous to the inauguration of President Roosevelt, the cry was for someone "to do something," and that the defeat of Hoover and his policies was brought about as much by Republicans who gave up the ship and recognized that this country needed new leadership, as by any other group.

The charge that the present administration has gone farther than the voters expected; is beside the point, for what was voted in 1932 was a "new deal." No one, excepting a group of politicians, is heard to complain over the results. The critics, for the most part, are those hungry to get back once more to the public trough.

The people got tired of the Mellon line in Washington, and through Roosevelt demanded a return to more democratic government. Despite Republican orators to the contrary the people voted for a change in the kind of government, and that is what they are now getting. Any inferences that this change is not beneficial, desirable or wanted, is insulting to the intelligence of the majority of the American people who asked for it, and on its face is nothing more than campaign talk.

This country suffered as long as it could under the rule of the previous administrations; now it is marching upward to recovery under new leadership, which has preserved the fundamentals of the American government, yet made them applicable to a new age and to new conditions.

It is easy for politicians to make attacks on the great recovery effort which is now succeeding in this nation. But candidates, parties and principles must be appraised on the basis of their achievements, not on their promises, or even their criticisms. The noticeable thing which is lacking to date is any suggestion of a better program to be used as a substitute for the present plans. Under such conditions the voters have little difficulty in choosing the course they wish to follow in comparing the demonstrated titles of leadership of their government.
