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MAKE WAY FOR THE PEOPLE! "The core of the American tradition," says Dr. Tugwell, "is to be found in a kind of defiance to fate."

Dr. Tugwell, who is either a smart young man in a big job or a fearful bogey-man with claws and cloven feet, depending on your point of view, made this remark before the convention of the American Society of Newspaper Editors in Washington.

He was trying to make clear that the administration welcomes criticism, and that any attempt at regimentation of American life in defiance of the will of the masses would be foredoomed to failure.

And in this remark there is a shrewd appreciation of a fundamental part of the American character—a part which both radicals and Tories tend to overlook.

"We (the people) will not do what we do not want to do, and coercion cannot make us," adds Dr. Tugwell. "We can be fooled, but not for long. We have a precious inventiveness which gets us out of holes. We have a saving irreverence for authority."

Here is an excellent point for everybody concerned to keep in mind. It makes these terrors of Communism, Fascism, and so on much less terrifying; for all such schemes must, sooner or later, run their heels onto this hard rock of stubborn contrariness—the fact that, in the long run, we will not do what we do not want to do, which is just another way of saying that in the end the honest wish of the majority will prevail.

It reminds one of that old story of the Fourth of July celebration in a small midwestern town half a century ago. The governor, a senator, and a couple of representatives were to address the citizens in a public park.

Pretty soon they started making their way through the crowd to the speakers' stand, and some flunky or other who was trying to clear a path for them called out, "Make way for the representatives of the people!"

Instantly someone in the crowd called back: "Make way yourself. We ARE the people!"

And that's what it all comes down to. The people's representatives, down at Washington, may advocate any kind of theory or nostrum they choose; eventually, if their fellow citizens don't like the looks of it, they will hear that old cry—"Make way yourselves. We are the people!"

THIS MACHINE AGE How completely a modern city is at the mercy of its machines! Drop a monkey wrench in one comparatively minor set of cogs and you can paralyze an entire community.

Gasoline filling station operators and gasoline truck drivers in Cleveland walked out. So effective was their strike that the city's supply of gasoline was completely cut off. As a result, the whole city was left helpless.

Private cars—delivery trucks, buses—all of these could run until their tanks were empty, and then they had to stop.

Because of a disagreement involving only some 2000 or so men, a community of a million people was brought to the edge of utter paralysis.

Never before in history has mankind so organized its communal life that such a thing could be true. Could there be a sharper illustration of our complete dependence on our machines?

LAST OF OLD CAVALRY It gives one a sort of old and grown-up feeling to read that the U. S. War Department has ordered the cavalry to put away its sabres.

The War Department points out that armored cars, tanks, and so on are replacing the horse throughout the mounted service, and that a cavalryman sitting in an auto has little use for a sabre; nevertheless, the thought that these jingling riders with their polished blades are now officially out of date comes as a bit of a surprise.

Cavalrymen without sabres—or, for that matter, without even horses! Shades of Attila and Bedford Forrest, of Custer and Ney and all the other captains who led galloping troopers into battle beneath a swinging arc of gleaming steel!

We must be getting old, if we have lived into a day when armies have no use for such things.

### DEATH SUMMONS LOCAL PHYSICIAN

#### Dr. John Schmershall Dies After Acute Diabetic Attack

Dr. John F. Schmershall, physician and surgeon, with offices in the Lloyd building, died in attending apartments at 12:50 p. m. on an acute diabetic attack, which resulted in a coma. He was stricken sometime early while in his office, and recovered consciousness. He was alone in the apartment at the time his wife, Mrs. Agnes Schmershall having returned to her former home at Jerome over the weekend. His son, Peter Clark Schmershall arrived from California this morning, little more than an hour before his father's death.

The body was removed to the White mortuary. Dr. Schmershall opened offices here three months ago. Since early days of the north coast, he had practiced at Jerome. He was a native of Pennsylvania, and was aged about 60. Among the fraternalists of which he was a member, is the Masonic lodge.

### FARMING LABOR AGENT ASSURED

#### Federal Representative for Job Finding Will Be Stationed Here

Establishment of a federal farm labor agent at the office of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce this season has been assured, according to word given today by Newell S. Wright, secretary of the chamber. From George E. Tucker, director of farm placement service of the department of labor, Kansas City, Mo., H. J. Adams, who served here last year, will be returned to Twin Falls to care for the placing of workers.

"It is the intention to continue this service along the same lines as last year," writes Tucker. Adams is to come here following a survey of labor conditions in Washington, Oregon and Idaho. Last season Adams placed 3,000 persons on jobs in this valley. Wright says, in expressing satisfaction over the ability of the Chamber of Commerce in relating the labor bureau. In the interim, the service has been supplied by the chamber's office.

### INSPECTOR URGES COVER SPRAYING

Hoplia Advises Orchardists That Covering Nuts Are Increasing Daily

It is time for the first cover spray, orchardists were notified today by A. H. Hoplia, district horticultural inspector.

"This spray should be completed as soon as possible as the colling moth flight is increasing each day. The real spider and two spot moths are also beginning to appear," he says.

"This spray should consist of two pounds of arsenate of lead and four ounces of one and one-half gallons of summer oil, according to the severity of the two spot moth and red spider last season.

"The trunks of the trees should be thoroughly saturated, as the two spot moths are in the ground and comes up the trunk of the tree in the spring.

"This insect caused severe damage last year, therefore we should be very thorough in all of our spraying as we can do it."
