BORAH AND THE G. O. P.

The idea of Senator Borah telling the Republican party how to run its affairs should be resented by those tried and true followers of Hamilton who have ade it what it is today.

Borah argues for making the party progressive.

Borah argues for making the party progressive, throwing out the conservative element, injecting new blood into the veins of the pachyderm, and otherwise indulging in a general housecleaning. But who, pray, is going to do the housecleaning? Certainly not Borah, or Johnson or Norris or La Foilette. The old guard would not stand for that And the conservative element is not going to turn suddenly progressive and suggest its own elimination. Any attempt of the so-called younger element to take over the reins will be met with the same kind of resistance exhibited at a recent Republican meeting here, when they were advised to eschew meeting here, when they were advised to eschew the direct primary, insist on loyal Republicanism, reject anyone with the taint of the "new deal," and

reject anyone with the taint of the "new deal," and otherwise remain in the path worn threadbare by the elephant, in addition to "going down to defeat rather, than straying from the principles which have made the party great."

Undoubtedly the senior senator from Idaho is right in theory, and is also logical in his judgment that "the Republican party is pretty close to the brink and unless it has an organization free from the influences which brought us to our present plight it will die as the old Whig party died—of sheer political cowardice."




