

CITY COUNCIL POINTS THE WAY

Assurances of a tax reduction in Twin Falls, made possible by stringent economies the past year under the leadership of Mayor Duncan McD. Johnston and the present administration, will be welcomed by the property swners of this city.

Two factors have made possible the slash in the general fund levy. One was the reduction last year of the budget for the operating departments to the lowest point in more than a decade; and the other was the heavy payment of delinquent taxes. In the first instance the budget of \$83,200, which was not exceeded by expenditures, compared with \$112,906 in 1930, and then downward in varying amounts to \$92,818 in 1925. In the second instance, the payment of delinquent taxes totalling \$21,000 contributed materially to the surplus of nearly \$40,000 on hand with which to start the new fiscal year.

Mayor Johnston and the commissioners have tak-

Mayor Johnston and the commissioners have taken the view that this sum, instead of being tied up in some capital investment, should be passed right on to the taxpayers, with the result that the levy for the general operating expenses of the city has been clashed from 10 mills to six mills, an unprecented

act here.

1 The city has no outstanding warrants, is in good shape financially, and is able to cut the tax levy, de-spite the necessary added expense required to insure FERA-laborers, and to replace some crumbling city

FERA laborers, and to replace some erumbling city property such as water mains and sprinkling equipment, erect a new band stand, restore salaries parially, and pay off two court judgments incurred by he previous administration.

The reduction on the levy will be noticeable on the tax statements next full. If all taxing units will go, as far as has the city in the commendable act of lessening taxation, they will be making a direct contribution not only to every property owner, but to the welfare of the community, for the crying need in this section and state is simpler government, low-fitness, and a solution of transportation and man-

er taxes, and a solution of transportation and mar-keting problems.

Twin Falls city administration cannot be expected to solve all these, but it can point to the way, as it has in cracking down on municipal taxes.


