STRIKERS MASS FOR NEW FIGHT IN MINNEAPOLIS

Police, Troopers Stand by As Food Shippers Plan to Run Gauntlet

Merchants Turning to Express And Parcel Post to Get Needed Items

MINNEAPOLIS, May 21 (UP)—Flying bricks and officers' clubs sent 30 drivers to hospitals today as a thousand pickets of striking truck drivers and hundreds of police fought at the city market.

The rioting among the pickets broke into a series of small but persistent outbreaks in trucks and attempted to run them through the strikers' blockade to outgoing grocery stores.

Meanwhile the committee of Minneapolis citizens wired the national labor board an offer to interfere in an effort to halt the strike.

13 DIE IN U. S. AERIAL CRASHES
