Dust storms and drouth put a peculiar reversal on the schemes of the triple-A gentlemen at Washington. Into the most modern of agricultural programs comes agriculture's most ancient blight. The old-time searcity economics emerges from the dust bin to crouch over the farm belt once more.

And as all this happens, the price of wheat goes recketing on the Chicago exchange. Somebody is good to the control of the description of the distribution of this disaster; and it won't be

Where does all this leave our farm program? When a nation sets out to cope with a problem arising from a too bountiful supply of everything, and the supply is suddenly cut short beyond all expectations, what then?

that we con-abundance.

And this is something that cannot be repeated too often; for its implications are of tremendous im-

portance.

It would be a good thing if the people learned to chant it like a chorus, over and over again—the world can produce so much that everybody can have enough of everything. For this is the fact with which all nollities exhause and all

all political schemes and all economic theories col-lide, sooner or later.

Beyond the reach of bad weather and bankruptcy,

strikes and layoffs, it emerges as the one great signi-ficant development of the twentieth century.

FUTILITY OF ARMAMENT

French newspapers are worried now by reports that Germany is constructing a chain of rocket bases along the frontier, ready to shower a vast number. of explosive rockets all over France.

One newspaper says, projectiles capable of traveling 125 miles have been developed, and it is estimated that with a large chain of rocket bases Germany could dump 50,000 tons of high explosives on French soil in one night.




