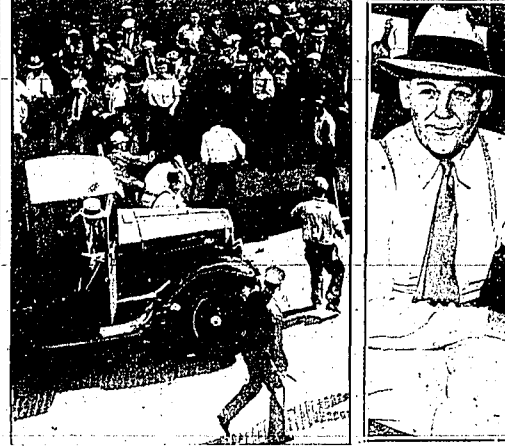

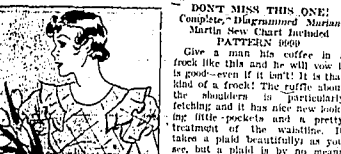



Turpentine Restores Flooring Appearance

By ROGER B. WHITMAN Home and Garden Expert. Written Especially for NEA. Service and Evening Times.

A varnished hardwood floor that is dingy from lack of care can be brightened by wiping with turpentine.

When varnish begins to wear, the worn places can be cleaned by wiping with soapy water, rigid with clean water, and, after thorough drying, given two or three coats of varnish.

If the dirt is ground into the varnish and will not come off, these places should be sandpapered.

Use Mucilage. Varnish that is too far gone should be taken off to the bare wood and the floor refinished. One way to take off the varnish is with a floor machine, which can be rented by the day from a hardware or paint store.

If the flooring is rough from wear, this machine will smooth it and greatly improve its appearance.

Can Be Bleached. A varnish remover can be used, which is filled with a can or some such mixture of three pounds of washing soda to one pound of water. The remover softens the finish, which is taken off by rubbing with steel wool.

After 12 hours for drying, a second coat is applied in the same way, and wiped after allowing time for soaking in.

Gloss Possible. The surface can be left as it is, with a "dull" gloss, or it can be rubbed to a medium gloss, or paste wax can be applied and rubbed, preferably with a machine, to a high polish.

A hardwood floor, whatever the finish, should never be flooded with water and scrubbed. It should be swept or wiped with dry brushes or cloths.

Damp mops can be used for cleaning badly soiled places, followed by immediate wiping with dry cloths.

HOUSEWIFE TOLD TO FIGHT MOTHS

Battle Must Be Continuous By Cleaning, Possible Breeding Spots

Damage to furs, woolens, and other fabrics by clothes moths is not only the result of moths, but by the worms that develop from their eggs.

Moths come in from outdoors seeking dark places in which to lay their eggs; closets, boxes, the crevices of upholstered and the inner parts of garments.

Continuous Fight. No house can be kept permanently free from them; the fight against them must be continuous. As soon as moths are seen on 300 eggs, each one seen should be swatted. When moths are continually found in upholstered and the inner parts of garments, it may be a bundle of woolens, a garment, a discarded pillow or a cell of art in attic, or on a closet shelf.

Watch Garments Closely. When moths are about, no garment should be left hanging unprotected for more than two weeks without being examined in all parts. On the clothing, a moth which is only a few days old, which may be a line of silk web, the garment should be brushed with a brush and hung in the sun and air.

All other fabrics held in closets for occasional use should have the same treatment. Mohair and other woolen upholstery material should be brushed with a brush and hung in the sun and air.

Silk covered in upholstery should be removed and brushed, for-in-crawling beneath them, the eggs are laid, and the worms which are left by which moths can reach them.

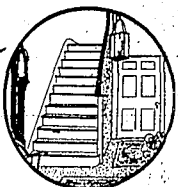

WITH Fresh Colors
This method should be used when the colors are fast. A stain should be made to tint about this.
A whitish and cloudy coat on a wood surface is usually taken off by wiping with a mixture of one quart of water and one tablespoon of vinegar, applied with a soft cloth rubbed with the grain.
Water rings and marks from dishes should be wet with a little turpentine; if not deep they will disappear as the turpentine dries.
Should a mark be too deep to be taken up in this way, a small amount of turpentine and a little turpentine should be used to rub out.

Water Rings Removed
A drop or two of raw linseed oil is placed on the mark, rubbed in a circular motion, and then frequently with a soft cloth to note the effect.
Should the mark not seem to be removed in this way, the only repair is to take off the injured varnish with fine sand paper or by scraping with the end of a razor blade, and to apply two or three thin coats of varnish to the level of the surrounding finish.

Polish with Pumice
The patch can be given a dull polish by gentle rubbing with a little finely powdered pumice stone and linseed oil. Pumice stone and water should be used.
A small scratch in varnish can be taken out by running a very fine turpentine along it, using a fine camel's hair brush. Another repair is to touch the scratch with white shellac.
Choice furniture can be kept in condition by daily wipings with soft and clean cloths. Should they be alone, cloths should be damp. The oil will combine with it to form a film that in time will be difficult to remove.
Daily dusting not only cleans the woodwork, but frequent rubbing is the best method for preserving and improving the finish.

Brush Out Grease
Grease stains on upholstery can be taken out by rubbing with any good dry cleaning liquid, using a soft brush with a circular motion, and working on a small area at a time.
Should the liquid be inflammable, as is the case with benzene, there should be ample ventilation, with no open flames nearby.
The work should be done on a damp day, for in dry weather the vapors may ignite the inflammable vapor.

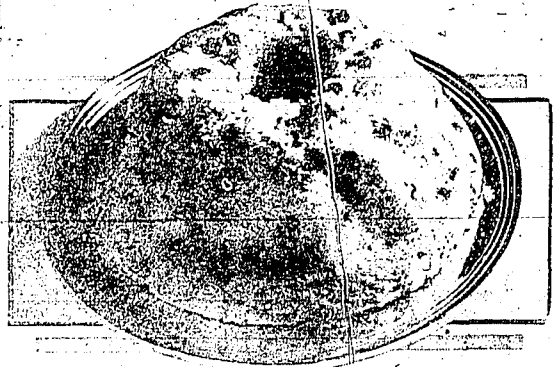
"The poppy is the badge of remembrance for those who sacrificed their lives in the country's service," Mrs. Age said. "It stands for the highest type of patriotism."

Tasty Desserts Await Family Table As Fresh Berries Appear on Market

In a few weeks, delicious berries of all kinds will be on the market and the smart housewife should have in reserve a few recipes that will make use of them.

This year, with cooking wheels and handies available, berry puddings take on new meaning. If you'd please the fussyest member of the family, try this recipe for steamed berry pudding with branley meringue.

Sift one and one-half cups of flour with one-half teaspoon of salt, two tablespoons of sugar and three teaspoons of baking powder.

With your fingers work in three tablespoons of butter and then add one-half cup of fresh blueberries which have been thoroughly washed, dried and dusted with flour. Be sure that the berries are covered with flour to prevent them from sticking to the bottom of the pan. Add enough milk to make a soft batter; pour the mixture into a small and steam in a regular steamer for one and one-half hours.

If you haven't a steamer, place the mold in a covered pan, half full of water, and let the water boil for the same length of time. When the pudding is cooked, turn

it out on a platter and serve at the table. The recipe serves six. Raspberries, blackberries or currants can be substituted for blueberries.

Brandy Sauce

Here's an excellent recipe for brandy sauce: Mix one cup of butter with three cups of powdered sugar and the yolk of two eggs. When the concoction is quite creamy, add three-fourths cup of hot water, juice of two lemons and one-fourth cup of brandy. Pour into a double boiler and cook until thickened. Serve in a bowl and let each person help himself.

CHANGE ON CROP LOAN ANNOUNCED

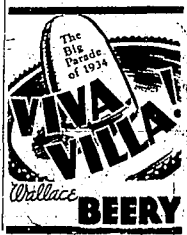
Shifts Include Privileges on Summer Fallowing, Buying Of Seed Wheat

Changes in the regulations of the emergency crop loan section of the Farm Credit administration, under which applicants may receive not less than \$10 more than \$250, were announced today by E. J. Finch, local inspector, with offices in the commissioners' room at the post house.

They include privileges to those engaged in summer fallowing, or for the combined purposes of summer fallowing and purchasing winter seed wheat. Maximum allowance for each purpose is \$1 an acre, Finch said, and will be made available in installments to those who can qualify.

The security, in the case of irrigation farming, shall be a first lien on crops harvested. Applications for these summer fallow loans must be received by the regional office not later than June 15.
