

Loss of life, as the result of the labor frontness in Toledo, is to be deplored.

The shut-down of factories, resulting in unemployment and ill-will created by such disturbances, is serious enough, without having added the tragedy of group murder.

of group murder.

It is hardly conceivable that the situation warranted the use of gin-fire, and if it did, then only the most trustworthy should be permitted to carry arms and fire them in an effort to suppress uprisings.

In the heat of passion which is generated by such occurrences as those in the industrial centers of the middlewest this week, anything can happen. People on the scene lose all sense of proportion. What is needed is a calming influence, cool judgment and manifestation of authority without violence.

"We are justified in criticising the actions which resulted in men being killed at Toledo, Thursday, at the hands of officers. What a contrast, for instance, with the incident earlier in the week, when two bandits were slain. In the latter case, society was served. In the Toledo case, nothing was gained by the blood-

In the Toledo case, nothing was gained by the blood-shed, and associates of the victims are now able to point to the "martyrdom" of their companions. The deaths, then, serve to promote the controversy, instead of stopping it; makes of the episode a memorable incident instead of one which might soon, have been forgotten; foments trouble, where the law's purpose and duty should be to settle it.


