WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—Reverses of drouth, dust storm and insect pests today suggested reversal of the government's wheat export policy and reduction in the wheat processing tax. Less than two months ago agricultural exports were being held back by new methods of shipping wheat abroad to relieve surplus pressure. There was even talk of petitioning for an increase in the 90,000,000-bushel quota allowed the United States by the international wheat agreement.

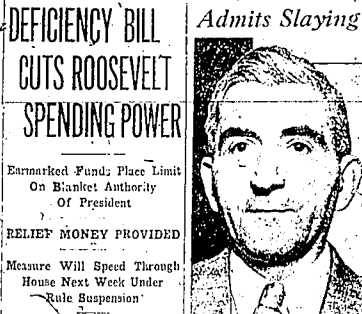

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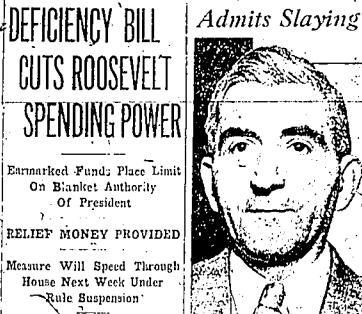

AGRICULTURAL OBSTETRICIAN

Editor Evening Times,

Dear Sir:

Recently I turned on the radio at the wrong time. It all depends on the point of view whether it would have been earlier or later. A voice which sounded as though the owner was trying to win the interest and cooperation of a group suffering from arrested development, was repeating a message. I did not learn the treatment of the brain child, but the old saying about the child being father to the man has anything to recommend it, the father could have been nothing less than an adult prodigy, whatever that is.

The man had a noble topic for a theme, though a trifle shop-worn and dog-eared at the corners, too. He wanted to help the farmer. They always seem to be wanting something they are not getting, or getting something they don't want and they have made so much to do about it that everybody just naturally wants to help them. You get the idea. This man had allowed it to almost get him down.

Now it seems that too much butter is being produced. His idea was to cut down production, thus raising the price of butter. To the ordinary garden variety type of land, the quickest, most painless way would be to take old Brindle the butcher, and, presto! The tier machine would be transformed into hamburger. Who ever heard of too much hamburger?

But let us get back to the speaker. His brain child was that each farmer turn ten per cent of his cultivated land into pasture. He should select the poorest land and plant any kind of seed just so it will produce a crop.

Now then, put the cows in the pasture, (got that?) cut out all other feed, let them have all the water they will drink. The maintenance has to be paid so nothing added to overhead on that score. The cows should, to get the results, be high producers, the higher the better, since it costs no more to keep them than would to keep scrubs, and even scientifically neglected they are capable of keeping more butter of the market than would be the case if scrub cows were kept!

The speaker made it all very clear. He pointed out that this method of feeding would not only increase the production of butter, but would save the farmer much work and expense. He would not need to use all that high-priced feed, this automatically does away with the work of raising it.

once the farmers catch on to a pasture idea, it will go over like wildfire.

Briefly: This plan when faithfully followed will cut down butter production, cut down on work, relieve rheumatism, neuritis, and indigestion, and, best of all, it will improve the net income!

Simple, isn't it? Now why didn't the farmers have thought of it for themselves, or at least with the help of their congressman?
