



"It would be encouraging to find, among scientists everywhere, some evidence of honest indignation at the way the gifts of science have been turned against society and therefore against science itself."

Brilliant men, for example, discover the secret of light, and enable men to soar through the air like the birds; and so far the chief result has been to make war infinitely more horrible and to include women and children on its casualty lists.


