Nurses Stationed on Hospital Ship Have Coveted Jobs

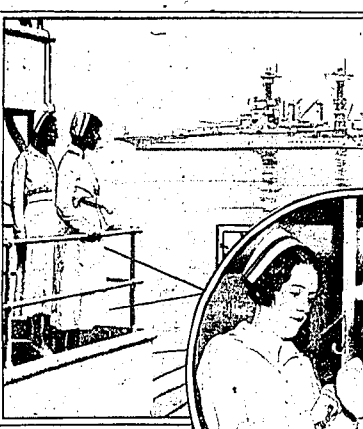
(NRA Service) NEW YORK, June 9.—At least twelve of the 35,000 girls who work in the big city need better life in the navy than they are getting in every port.

**THE SECOND IDAHO CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT TODAY FINDS ITSELF WITHOUT A CONGRESSMAN AS THE RESULT OF THE DEATH LAST EVENING OF REPRESENTATIVE THOMAS C. COFFIN.**

All Idaho mourns his untimely passing while serving the people of his state at Washington. Struck down suddenly in an unfortunate automobile accident Tuesday evening, the Idaho congressman was doomed from that moment on, never fully regaining consciousness. The vacancy in the halls of congress, which his death creates, will be difficult to fill.

**He and his colleague, Compton I. White, were Idaho's first native-born congressmen.** He served with distinction, as he had other offices of public trust, including that of mayor of Pocatello, which position he occupied at the time of his election to congress in November, 1932.

Coffin issued his statement of candidacy for reelection on the Democratic ticket only this week, announcing that he would base his campaign on his record. It was known that he would be a formidable contender for the nomination, and, if successful at the polls, a likely winner in November. But now all this is beyond speculation.

His shocking death robs the Gem state of one of its distinguished citizens. He served them well, and had he been permitted to live, would have brought further honor upon himself.

His many friends here join with those others in the district, the state and at the nation's capitol in deploring the passing of this native son, and to his family and loved ones give expressions of deep sorrow and abiding sympathy.

**A NEW AMERICA**

President Roosevelt, in a momentous message to Congress yesterday, outlined a broad program of economic and social reform offering security for the individual, the family and the home.

He proposed, among other things, that next winter the nation undertake a plan of security against unemployment and old age.

This is another phase of national planning, of anticipating the future, and not awaiting the time when misfortune arrives.

Coming as the message did, just two days following a statement of principles put forth by the Republican national committee, the contrast is significant.

The opposition party's declaration said: "We must not see destroyed in four years a civilization which has been centuries in building and which has brought to our nation greater progress, well-being and happiness than have ever been enjoyed by any nation, any time, anywhere."

One is the philosophy of relying on past greatness, of living in the era before 1929, and depending upon hope to provide the republic with continued security. The present administration's method is to recognize our shortcomings, meet the emergencies, face the issues and plan to solve them with the resources of the America of today.

Truly the Roosevelt document is one of the most important ever transmitted to capitol hill by this administration. It is discerning in its frankness, for it submits to the American people a program to be considered, not now, but next year, affording months of time for argument, examination and for making constructive suggestions for improvement.

Its net result, whether or not its proposals are ever put into effect, is to increase the country's admiration for the President, to establish entire confidence in his purposes, and to give the American people a glimpse of the destiny which might be theirs.

**GRAND OLD PARTY**

Naming of Henry P. Fletcher to be national chairman of the Republican party, appears to have been received with cold indifference on the part of the public, and outright disappointment on the part of that element which had hoped for progressive leadership.

Fletcher, a hang-over from the Hoover regime, is about as much like Everett Sanders, his predecessor, as the other pea in the pod. What the Borah and other liberal elements in the party wanted was a younger westerner, typical of the Young Republican leaguers, who could attempt to rebuild the party along lines offering stiff competition to the majority party.

But the national committee, stuck to its guns, rejected a change in program, and decided to "fight it out" along these lines if it takes all summer.

The party's officials can be commended for one thing, at least: they are consistent. They say in effect we are going to have undiluted Republicanism even if the party dies in the attempt. That is the implication of the Fletcher appointment.
