

It is a sad commentary upon our system of gov-

It is a sad commentary upon our system of government, but nevertheless a truism, that economic conditions should improve now that Congress has adjourned.

Traditionally there is hesitancy on the part of business to forge ahead while the nation's laws are in the process of being revamped. This is not because the American people have come to fear the results of congressional acts, but rather, on account of the assurance which results when it is known that no new changes in governmental regulations can be made for a few months, at least. This gives business, agriculture, commerce, a breathing spell, of which they are quick to take advantage.

It goes without saying that the session of Congress just closed has been all-important. It is deserving of the highest praise, for it has enacted into law an ad-

just closed has been all-important. It is deserving of the highest praise, for it has enacted into law an additional quota of progressive legislation calculated to improve the situation. It hardly is to be expected that all of these legislative enactments will receive universal commendation, but in the main, they may be expected to prove beneficial.

Above all things, it cannot be said of the Congress just ended that it was a "do-nothing" session.

Actually, there can be no summation of the enactments until the executive branch of the gövernment has functioned with respect to the legislation—until the President has legalized the bills by signing those

he chooses.

But enough have already been signed to make the session historic, and worthy of praise, despite the fact that no tears will be shed over its adjournment.


