

PUERILE PUBLICITY

What this country needs is fower publicity agents. It would be un-American to wish that the mimeographs could be put out of commission. That would raise the charge that free speech and a free press were being denied—but if that army of individuals now engaged in grinding out long-winded accounts of Mr. Whoozit's address to the Ro-wan ians in national convention could be relegated to the ranks of the unemployed, the newspapers would feel that at least one prayer was answered.

A newspaperman's mail has to be carted to the office in bales, for it is laden with propagandamostly. About every 79th letter is personally written and that one, more often than not, turns out to be, not a bouquet, but a brickbat.

The publicity letters to the daily newspapers are from every conceivable source, including the government, and represent a huge outlay in paper, printing, mimeographing, inserting, sealing and stamping on the part of the senders, and additional costs by the newspapers for janitor and junk-hauling.

Not a fraction of one per cent of the bank is ever used. If it were, newspapers would be so duit, that no one would ever read them, thus defeating the purpose of the propagandists.

The advertising columns offer opportunity for the large national institutions to talk about the merits of their wares, and their advertising advisers are intelligent enough to sense that readers do not want propaganda mixed up with their news.

But there still are a great many firms, institutes, associations, leagues and organizations of all sorts, which are continuing to waste their substance. If about 99 out of every 100 publicity letters could be plowed under, Postmaster General Farley could lay off half his crew and never miss them.

Publicity agents have their place, but their product, when wanted, is solicited, usually. The unsolicited publicity, for the most part, constitutes an insult to the intelligence of the average newspaper editor, and is an effrontery to journalism in this rountry.

UNCLE SAM, LEADING BANKER People who like to sit about and discuss whether

Since the banking crisis of March, 1933, great changes have swept across the whole banking world, changes so sweeping that few realize them. The American Bankers' association recently summed up some of them, and the picture it draws is enlighten-

some of them, and the picture it draws is enignically.

For instance, we used to have 30,800 banks, back in 1921. Now we have something more than 14,000, a decrease of around 16,000 (over half).

About 4,000 banks have vanished since March, 1933. Several thousand banks owe the R. F. C. more than half a billion dollars on pledge of valuable parts of their assets.

The R. F. C. has taken more than a billion dollars worth of stack in 6,000 banks by way of increasing.

The R. F. C. has taken more than a billion dollars worth of stock in 6,400 banks by way of increasing capitalization, including many of the strongest banks in the country. Thus it has an interest in 44 per cent of all banks today.

A million peopole and institutions have borrowed

from the 5,800 leaning associations and corporations started by the government to extend various types

started by the government to extend various types of credit.

The R. F. C. also has direct loans to various corporations totalling around \$700,000,000.

In the deposit field, the postal savings system has grown amazingly. More than 2,300,000 people now have savings on deposit in the \$,000 postoffices authorized to receive them. A thousand such offices have had to be added during the last four years.

Private agencies have virtually abdicated from the credit field, the survey indicates. From 1922-31 securities floated in private capital markets averaged more than five billions a yearr During 1932-1933 these issues shrank to \$621,000,000 a year, a decrease of almost 90 per cent. Somebody had to do the financing. So the treasury did it.


