

WATER CONSERVATION

It is good to see the irrigation interests of the Snake river valley alert to the need for constant and improvement of supplemental water rights

tights. The whole upper valley has been waging a united campaign recently in opposition to the enlargement of the American Falls dam, on the theory that such an improvement would preclude the construction of needed storage and flood control facilities in their otyn section.

own section.

Whether their fears were well-founded or not, does not detract from the fact that the interests were looking after the future welfare of their tracts, and that they were united on a program for securing additional benefits.

ditional benefits.

The users of water from the American Falls reservoir should be equally alert to their needs. While the interests of the contracting companies helow the reservoir are not opposed to the interests of the users above the dam, the companies under the dam have certain problems peculiar to themselves which must be considered separately, such for instance, as the proposed federal power contract.

A season like this one, brings the need for water conservation to the fore. Apparently this need is not being overlooked, and because of this there is every reason to express commendation.

reason to express commendation.

THE FUTURE COURSE

As Congress adjourns, treating itself to a wistful backward glance, and husiness leaders meet in Washington to figure out what the future ought to hold for NRA, a little word of warning from William Allen White is worth a bit of thought.

Mr. White addressed the University of Kansas graduating class, and remarked that we face two dangers, both stemming off the same point.

One danger, he said, is that in anxiety to get the wheels moving we may deliver ourselves lock, stock, and barrel into the hands of a great plutocracy anxions to run the country for its own purposes.

The other is that we may hand a very delicate and complicated bit of social and economic machinery over to untrained politicians who are eager to get

over to untrained politicians who are eager to get power, but who do not know how to use it intelligently.

power, but who do not know how to use it intelligently.

And in looking ahead, Mr. White added:

"The most dangerous enemy to democracy today is a man with a rigid plan either for recovery or for reconstruction. He is likely to feel that adoption of his plan is more important than the retention of liberties which may endanger it."

We are very fortunate, as a matter of fact, that our future course has not yet been definitely charted. No one knows what will follow the NRA; no one, so far, has even made any very concrete suggestions about it. We hardly lifewerenigh yet to decide on our course.

Certainly there is no unanimity of opinion about what sort of control the government should exercise in the field of industry, as a permanent thing.

Since this is the case, it behooves us to look very critically at any plan which is too rigid, too complete, too definite. The best thing about our situation right now is that everything is flexible.

We are committed to very little; we can discard, a change, and revise at will, with no hard and fast plans to get in the way of adherence to our traditional liberties.

Sooner or later, of course, some definite plan must come—if it is only a plan to leave things alone. But there is no rush For the moment, any inflictible urea.


