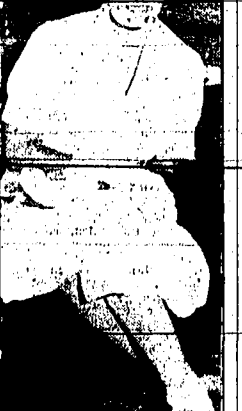

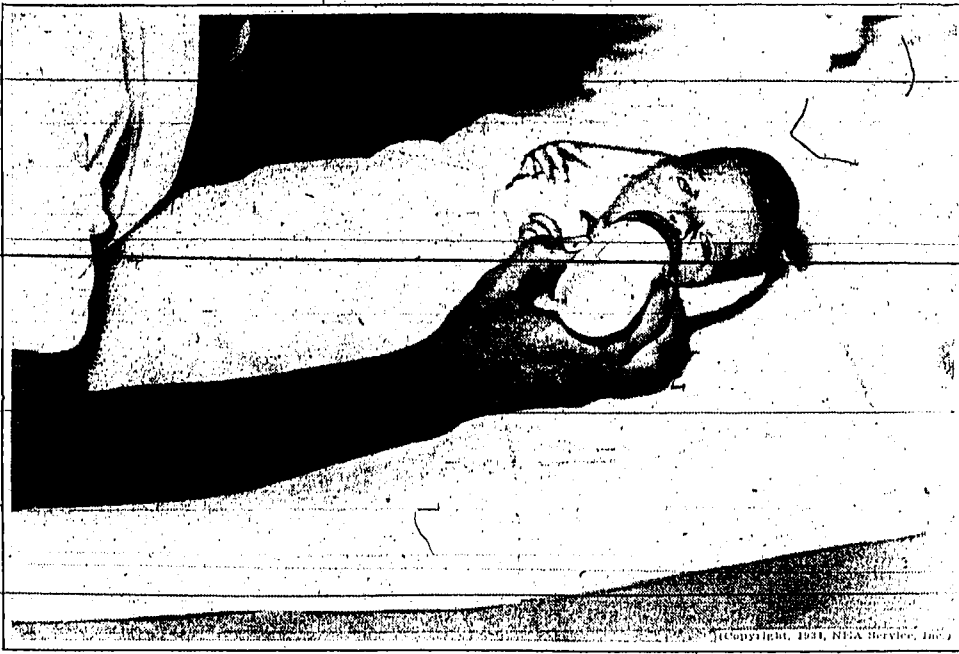

Soviet Crushes Ukraine Plots

MOSCOW (UP)—The Russian transfer of the capital of the Ukrainian Republic from Kharkov to its ancient site, Kiev, is interpreted in official circles here as an indication that the Soviet government has completely crushed Ukrainian attempts to establish a separate state. This belief is supported by the fact that Kiev generally has been considered the strongest of the Ukrainian Republic's geographical points. Kiev is several hundred miles nearer Poland, from whence in Soviet opinion, a large part of the independence propaganda is being conducted. There, observers here do not believe that the transfer would have been made had not the Soviet government been convinced that the independence movement had been effectively checked. It is also true, however, that the physical movement of the government and its organization at Kiev gave Soviet authorities an opportunity to receive Ukrainian officials who were supporters of independence.

LOUIS, Mo., (UP)—Contentious will disposing of \$1,000,000 ultimately to Yale university developed testimony that the original owner 43 years ago, in Paris, drew up an almost identical will. 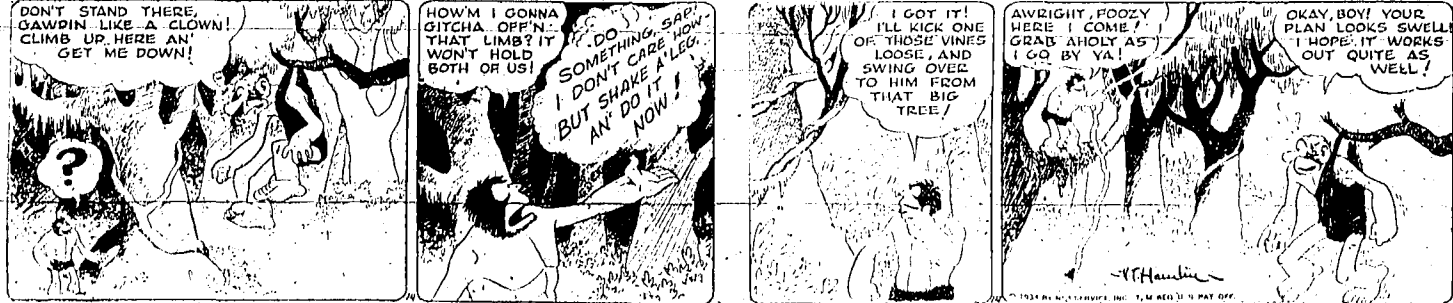
