FRANCO-ITALIAN ACCORD PLANNED, DUCE ANNOUNCES

Significant Peace Agreement Will Be Signed at End Of October

MILAN, Italy, Oct. 6 (AP)—Premier Benito Mussolini announced today to a cheering crowd in Cathedral Square today that a Franco-Italian agreement—considered one of the most significant accords in recent years—would be signed at the end of October.
Announcement by the Fascist premier was heard alone on a loud-voice radio before a crowd of 200,000 in the square and side streets, confirmed United Press dispatches of last week forecasting the accord between the two nations.

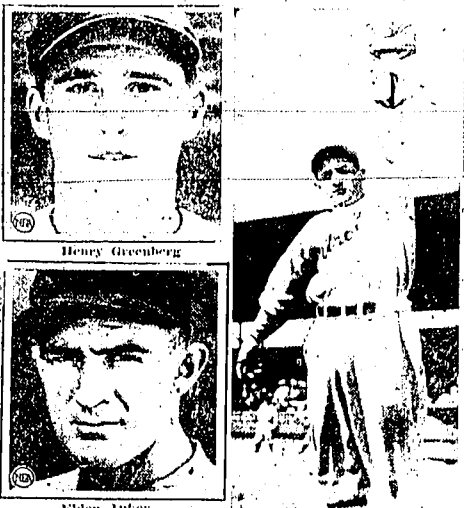
