### WOULD LIMIT FORTUNES

**Louisiana Solons Considering "Poor Man's" Laws on Debts, Utilities**

BATON ROUGE, La., Nov. 13 (UPI)—Sen. Huey P. Long today unveiled the national program which his friends and political associates say he hopes will put him in the running as a presidential candidate.

In an interview with the United Press, Long was vague about presidential aspirations, but should lucky luck smile, he intimated, he would not be asleep. He said:

**Guarantee to Families**

"If I was running this country, my guarantee of fortune of not less than \$5,000, and more if necessary, to every American family to provide for a home, the education of their children, and to something to eat and something to drink."

"I'd limit the amount of any man's fortune to \$30,000,000 or less, if it is necessary to guarantee a home and comfort for all people."

**Solons Ponder Bills**

Long gave his interview in the new \$5,000,000 state capitol where his closely controlled legislature is in session passing laws he says will make Louisiana a Utopia. Both houses met in special session last night to pass Long's program of "poor people's laws," including a moratorium on all debts for two years, a plan for scaling down burdensome private debts, and a measure to force drastic reductions in gas and electricity rates.

**These bills**, Long said, are a part of his national program. If he were running the entire United States, instead of just Louisiana, which he controls with an iron hand, he'd "guarantee every man

## BEET MEN HEAR SUGAR BENEFITS

**Series of County Gatherings Will Acquaint Growers With Cash Aid**

Second of a series of meetings

designed to bring detailed information to beet growers on the domestic allotment plan whereby they will share in the present processing tax on sugar, will be conducted at Kimberly high school tonight, after days of fruitless waiting for word from the abductors.

**Old Age Pension**

Alon would give a pension to all persons over 60, and would provide a 30-hour week for all workers, with a month's vacation every year.

**DAYTON ROULJE, La., Nov. 13 (UPI)—With the passage of his "motorization law" granting a two-year holiday to all debtors in Louisiana a foregone conclusion, Senator Huey P. Long moved today to check any attempt by creditors at repossess before the law becomes effective.**

He announced, to the ways and means committee of the house that the legislature would adopt a resolution suspending all foreclosures and repossessions until such time as the motorization law becomes operative.

"This resolution is necessary," he explained, "to get away from any epidemic of seizures by mortgagors that want to force collection while there is still time."

# DEFEAT BY NAVY BRINGS IRISH "STUPID" RATING

## ACK OF BRAINS HANDICAPS TEAM

**Notre Dame Beats Powerful Squad But Field Generals Ruin Efforts**

CHICAGO, Nov. 13 (UPI)—Notre Dame had to make a thousand mistakes to lose to Navy, as the Irish played it safe and made a thousand and one.

Well, maybe not quite that many but enough to justify the use of the word "stupid" in describing the Notre Dame team. William Shakespeare—the poet and playwright, not Notre Dame's left halfback—coined a phrase which fits this Notre Dame team perfectly. It was, "full, brainless A&X."

**Wasted Energy**

This seems to be another Notre Dame team of wasted energy, lost motion, blunders and brainstorms. The Irish have the manpower, the speed, the raw material for a great football team. They lack a dynamic leader, a cool, clear-headed field general. A St. Rutherford or a Carlsbad is sorely needed. Notre Dame gained 200 yards from rushing to Navy's 47, and 83 yards from passes to Navy's 77. The 83-yard gain was gained by rushing, after an 80-yard run, alone touchdown, which resulted from a 55-yard kickoff return by Andy Pliny, a 5-yard penalty on Navy and a 17-yard pass. Pliny went to Marty Peters, who made a remarkable catch to get the ball.

**Too Many Blunders**

The Irish used three quarterbacks, and they made enough blunders to lose every game left on the schedule. They hammered at the center of the Navy line, baccarding plays directed at the Middle flanks, which finally paid off. They kept trying a one-man aerial attack, which finally paid off the way for Navy's touch down.

With the score 3-0 against Notre Dame and the ball on Navy's 39-yard line, midway in the fourth period, the Irish committed a colossal blunder. It was fourth down and two yards to go. The Notre Dame quarterback called for a pass when the situation called out for a punt. There was still time to win the game. Navy's attack had been impotent throughout the game. A punt deep in Navy territory undoubtedly would have ended the drive, but the ball bucked in midflight in plenty of time to launch another drive.

**Sore Toe Touch**  
Failure to punt enabled Navy to get out of the hole, and a few minutes later the Midshipmen had scored a touchdown and had a 10-0 lead.

Melnickovich alone gained almost twice as much as the whole Navy backfield on running plays, racking 80 yards to Navy's 47. Shakespeare gained 50 yards, three more than Navy's entire crew.

This comment isn't intended to take anything away from Navy's gallant little football team which will be tough for any team to conquer. The Middle played on the theory that the team that gets the most points wins, and there's no argument which can offset that final score: Navy 10, Notre Dame 6.
