**Additional arguments why Twin Falls county should again be restored to first-class rating have been advanced as the result of action taken by the Taxpayers League, endorsing the proposal.**

When the change was made two years ago by the state legislature, economy was the reason assigned for the move.

It appears that if the present board of county commissioners held strictly to the regime expected of such officers in second class counties, in which classification the county now is, they would be meeting about once every quarter. Bills would lapse, delinquent taxes would go uncollected, and the business of the county would flounder. All because of a chance to cut the monthly salary of each commissioner from \$125 to \$75.

It has been shown that by having the county in first-class rating, it has been for most of the past decade or more, savings approximating \$5000 annually are made by being in position to pay bills monthly and to take discounts. In addition to this, there are many other savings resulting from the county commissioners' being on the job more steadily, looking after details and in general keeping interested in their tasks.

The matter of changing the county's classification rests with the legislature, and for the most part with this county's delegation in that body. They are being petitioned for the change by the Taxpayers League, and it appears that the legislators will be exercising good judgment, and conforming to the wishes of their constituency if they make sure the measure is acted upon favorably at the present session.

**NO COMIC OPERA IN WAR**

Wars in Latin America are popularly supposed to be comic opera affairs. The memoirs of soldiers of fortune, and innumerable romantic-adventure novels, have sold us on the idea that such campaigns are usually very picturesque, enlivened by the presence of the gold-braided general for every three barefoot privates, but not very bloody.

Recent summaries of the fighting between Bolivia and Paraguay in the Gran Chaco region show that in this case, at least, the popular ideas are all wrong.

Latest figures show that fully 40,000 soldiers have been killed in that war; 25,000 Bolivians and 15,000 Paraguayans. When casualties are recorded on that scale—for the populations of the two countries are not large—it is no comic opera war—that is being fought.

As a result, the senator is preparing to resume hearings early in January, and expects to give the country some new revelations quite as interesting as those which have already been made.

The ordinary citizen, unquestionably, will look on this announcement as very good news indeed. There had been some disconcerting rumors that the administration did not look on the committee's work with a kindly eye.

In view of the vast importance to every citizen of the information which this committee has been digging up, it is good to know that its work has been endorsed at the White House. That ought to make it certain that it will be continued.
