### Mighty Colorado Will Feel Curb at Boulder Within Two Months

BY NORMAN H. DEVEL  
BOULDER CITY, Nev. (AP)—The temperamental Colorado, fierce and untamed, has been tamed through long ages, will feel the curbing hand of man within two months, when two and one-half years ahead of schedule, storage of water behind Boulder Dam will begin.
