FLEES IN STOLEN AUTO

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Jan. 21 (UPI)—Federal agents and police concentrated their search for Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell in the New Jersey and Atlantic City areas. They expect that the license plates of a stolen automobile would lead them to the two miscreants.

Karpis, most sought of the nation's fugitive gunmen and kidnapers, and Campbell, shot their way through the city last night, leaving machine gun marks of Sunday and fled through a doorway of rain in an automobile stolen from a newsstand.

Love Women Behind.

They left behind, most of their firearms, and Campbell's choice of armament was a pistol and revolver.

Both were wounded slightly in the fight.

Police arrested Karpis and Campbell, who had been captured in a gun battle with police armed only with pistols.

Federal agents supplied information that Karpis and Campbell had been traveling with a load of arms.

They spread their search from the midwest to New England, and then to New York, the Bronx, and the Bronx Park area, and then spread over New Jersey and to the Holland Tunnel, which leads to New York.

## JUSTICES BOOST MOONEY'S FIGHT

Supreme Court Denies Move  
For Protection But Hears

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Jan. 21 (UPI)—Tom Mooney's application for a pardon will be considered by the Supreme Court, probably not until after the legislature has completed its session late in April.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (UPI)—Alvin Karpis, who has been fighting his long fight to be freed from San Quentin, Calif., penitentiary, refused to permit

The court to refuse to permit Mooney to file with it a petition for an original writ of habeas corpus.

Mooney, 60, is seeking a break in his fight for freedom.

Chief Justice Charles E. Hughes read the Mooney order which extensively reviewed the case, and the serious charges against him, and said on which he based his plea.

The reply of the state attorney general opposing Mooney's plea was critical of the defense for not meeting the issues raised by the petition.

The court appeared to have opened the way for a further and perhaps more fruitful procedure in the state court.

The order was considered a victory by the defense, which has refused to entertain the Mooney's claim for a writ of habeas corpus.

## SAVANTS TERM MOON SURFACE HIGHLY ROUGH

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (UPI)—The moon surface, where savants have had to make do with the available materials, is highly rough, according to the Swiss mountain climber, the Carnegie Institution.

Studies of variations in intensity of moonshine during phases of the moon, made by the Mt. Wilson Observatory, California, confirmed earlier reports, made by Galileo 300 years ago, that the moon's surface is excessively rough.

Astronomers estimated the height of most mountains at 10,000 feet while others believe the mountains are 20,000 feet deep. Jagged peaks dot the surface and there are no smooth plains.

Because of differences in gravity, the weight of man on the moon would be one-sixth that on Earth, so it would be hard to take his own oxygen because of lack of atmosphere. A wide range of clothing would be required and temperatures ranging from 250 degrees above zero to 200 below.

## GET PASSENGERS, RAILROADS TOLD

Eastman Points Out Method  
For Roads to Overcome  
Financial Loss

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (UPI)—Joseph H. Eastman, federal coordinator of transportation, today suggested to railroads they develop a plan to overcome financial difficulties out of their present financial moratorium.

The roads, he said, in a report to Congress, "offer great opportunities for profit if they cease regarding passenger traffic as an unavoidable and unwanted side effect."

The opportunities lie, Eastman said, in "improved service, modernized equipment, better maintenance, elimination of wasteful methods, and cooperation and aggressive pricing and selling. Can Be Profitable"

Contending passenger traffic is not necessarily unprofitable, Eastman said, and the railroads have been tremendously stimulated in recent years and months by the urged railroads to participate in this development and share the benefits.

The report said railroads can increase their profits by reducing costs of operation, increasing earnings and operations of a principal rail highway, and air passenger carriers. Customer opinion was gauged to show 70,000 replied to a passenger ballot.

The survey found passenger traffic was not necessarily unprofitable. Airline losses were broken even. Buses earned a slight margin above cost, but an inadequate investment return. The railroads lost \$10,000,000 in passenger service while receiving only \$500,000 in revenue.

## ENGLISH PILOTS SET HIGH MARK

Royal Air Force's Aviators  
Fly 47,000,000 Miles  
During 1934

LONDON, Jan. 21 (UPI)—British Royal Air Force airplanes flew about 47,000,000 miles in 1934.

This estimate, by an authority, also includes commercial flights which creates a record for post-war service flying. The previous highest mileage was 44,000,000 miles in 1933.

In 1933, the Royal Air Force was about one-third of its present size; the machines now serve only one-tenth of the distance flown down in 1934.

The 93 squadrons of the service sustained 19 fatal accidents in the year, involving 21 deaths. At the time the strength of the force was only 33 squadrons, there were 22 fatal accidents, and the death rate per 100 hours for British military aviation since the war has been 1920, when 61 squadrons suffered 64 fatal accidents and 85 deaths. Accidents Decrease

The number of fatal accidents in proportion to flying hours has decreased from 1920 to 1934. Every hour of flying in 1920 was attended by a death, but in 1934 there was only one death in every 12,000 hours. In addition, the British air force has an exceptionally good record in other accidents which were not fatal but caused injury to passengers.

It is believed that the year record is particularly striking when it is recalled that there was a big increase in the number of aerobatics and maneuvers conducted as far as possible under active service conditions. Royal Air Force pilots have patrolling and policing duties over a million square miles of territory.
