IDAHO U. HELPS ON 18 PROJECTS

College of Agriculture Gave Wide Cooperation in 34 Findings-Reports

MOSCOW (Special)—The extent to which the University of Idaho college of agriculture has cooperated with the federal and state governments in various phases of the emergency program for agriculture is revealed in Dean E. J. Hastings report on activity during the past 18 months. During this time, the college of agriculture has been identified with 18 separate projects in the emergency program—and of these has had primary and principal responsibility in 12.

Practitioners have served as officers in administering this work in the counties and when rural home help has been required it has been secured locally. Altogether 1,323 people, not counting members of the experiment station and extension division staffs or special clerical workers, have helped in carrying on these projects. The county organizations, including production control members, officers and committees, embrace 948 in the first wheat production control program and the first corn-grow control program.

The list of projects for the 18-month period follows: Tax delinquency study; rural housing survey; farm debt adjustment; farm credit program; first wheat production control program; first corn-grow control program; first county production control program; rural rehabilitation study; rural electrification survey; sugar beet production control; first drought cattle and sheep purchase; drought feed survey; grainshopper and mormonism survey; first error Roush drought relief committee program; first conservation program for relief; rural housing program; Taylor bill providing for land utilization study; and second corn-grow program.

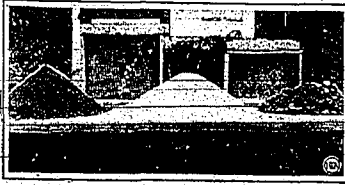

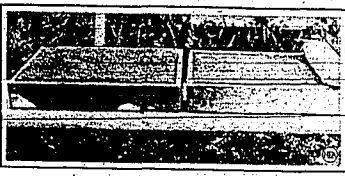

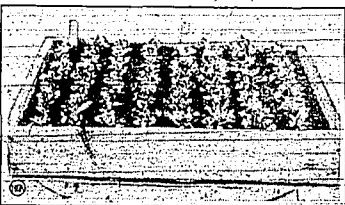

He took the plan to his cousin, a basket weaver. The basket was made. When the little girl outgrew the Dietz's but it is a friend.

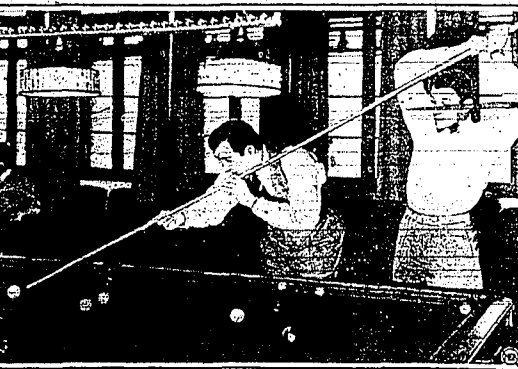
A friend of the friend saw the basket, wanted some like it. They carried it was the only one of its kind—the Dietz special. Then an attorney friend suggested Dietz patent it.

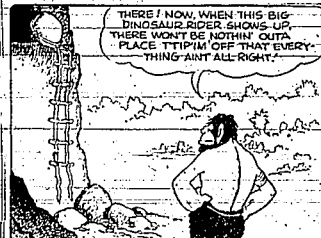

By RALPH E. OLMSTEAD WASHINGTON (Special)—Political parties, like everyone else, have their favorite prayers. The Republicans, each night, we have been told, before going to bed, pray the Lord, Huoy Long's soul to keep. On Huoy Long, are Republican hopes for 1936. His speeches designed to secure the support of all radical elements, considered by supporters of the minority side of the chamber, as things of beauty and joy forever. The possibility, day by day, grows stronger that this Louisiana senator will run for President as a third party candidate in 1936. If he does, announce the Republicans, his votes will all come from the Democratic column.
