"Raymond Hamilton wants to see you."

The man, Holtz, forced McClelland to drive several miles from Houston. When they stopped another man joined Hamilton and both had spent the week-end here.

"The outlaw assured the reporter that he would not be harmed, but said they would have to be blind before he would talk."

"They'll never give up," Holtz told McClelland.

"McClelland is stuck it out to get by to be off."

"It's all right," he said. "I'm a killer," Hamilton continued. "I never killed anybody, and I don't want to kill anybody."

After the conversation, Hamilton and Holtz bound the reporter with handkerchiefs and wire, then gagged him.

McClelland said as he prepared to leave:

"I'm going to leave my finger prints on your car. That's so every body will know I kept my word about seeing you."

## RICHBERG JOINS AIR WAVE FIGHT

**Recovery** - Chief - Appeals - for  
Calm in Johnson, Long  
Coughlin Clash

**WASHINGTON**, March 19 (UPI) - Recovery co-ordinator, Al Johnson, recovered control of the turbulent "Chumpkin-Johnson-Long battle" of the air force.

He appealed for "calm, dispassionate examination of facts," rather than the "shouting, ranting and shouting" of the "airplane politics" in a national radio forum address.

Johnson's address was the latest direct administration move to participate in the debate of national affairs engaged in by Father Coughlin, the radio orator, Sen. Joseph J. Johnson and Sen. Fred H. (Fritz) Long.

It quoted General Johnson, and referred to him as a "popular humorist" who has a "characteristic disregard for personal responsibility" and "a desire to be a direct mentor of Senator Long and Father Coughlin."

## MEXICAN SALARY BATTLE LOOMING

**MEXICO CITY**, March 19 (UPI) - A serious clash between the government and industrial workers in large measure by American and British capital was threatened today over a government decree to raise wages of foreign oil workers employed in the Tampico oil field.

The Employers' association, which includes Standard, Texaco and Agip Oil companies and the National railway, announced it would fight the decree.

## ABYSSINIA ASKS LEAGUE'S HELP

**GENEVA**, March 19 (UPI) - Abyssinia has asked League help against war with Italy on the Somaliland border in Africa, appealing to the League of Nations to do its bidding.

The appeal involves an extra session of the council at which the German arms situation might also be discussed.

Abyssinia's note charged Italy with flagrantly violating treaties and agreements and threatening attack. It invoked article 18 of the covenant involving action against the threat of war.

## Cabinet Resigns in Belgian Gold Crisis

**BRUSSELS**, March 19 (UPI) - The resignation resulted from the current financial and monetary crisis, which has caused the gold embargo in a desperate effort to save the Belgians against devaluation.

Premier Georges Theuns, at the opening of the chamber of deputies, read a statement declaring that the Belgian government had no alternative but to resign.

## AN IMPORTANT ACTIVITY

An annual banquet of the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association tonight again emphasizes the worth of this organization which has played an important part in the development of the game resources of this section.

With a membership which includes all the sportsmen and many others in this section, the association has been active here for years, maintaining a live organization guided by capable officers.

Work in fish propagation has been stressed, but activities have also included equal attention to fowl and to wild game, and a general effort to observe open seasons, to secure beneficial legislation, to protect the game, fish and fowl resources and to encourage the best interests of sportsmen in south central Idaho.

A practical example of accomplishment is seen in the fish hatchery promoted by the association and located on Rock creek here. The state game department works in complete harmony with the association group in its maintenance and care and counts it one of the assets of the department.

With Snake river rated one of the best fishing streams in the United States and with the world of other sports resources all over this section, ranging into the heart of the Sawtooths to the north, it is important that encouragement be given the work of such institutions as the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association.

The annual banquet of the local group offers opportunity for a review of the year's activities and brings about a renewed interest in carrying on an important work.

## A HERO IN PEACE

Records of the United States army list a great number of heroes, and nearly all of them are men who faced great peril on the field of battle. But there are a few who performed their deeds of heroism in time of peace, and one of these was James Hildebrand, who died in Atlanta the other day at the age of 80.

Hildebrand was one of the buck privates who, in 1901, volunteered to aid Dr. Walter Reed and his associates in the research that made it possible to bring yellow fever under control. The scene was Havana, where yellow fever was almost disrupting the army.

Some of these men slept in beds just vacated by men who had died of yellow fever, wore the dead men's clothing, ate out of their utensils, and made every other possible effort to be infected.

The others lived in the most hygienic surroundings, but submitted to bites by fever-infected mosquitoes. In this way it was learned definitely that the mosquito transmits the infection, the control of the disease was made possible.

Few men in our army's history dared more to accomplish greater ends than did this man Hildebrand and his buddies.

## POOR CHANCE FOR NOTORIETY

The young woman in Missouri who asked a county sheriff to let her spring the trap at the hanging of a condemned murderer, on the ground that she wanted to know what it felt like to hang a man, has given the nation just about the most unpleasant little morsel for contemplation that anyone could imagine.

Offhand, one suspects that what she really wanted was a bit of notoriety rather than the thrill of taking a human life. Volunteering to perform an execution is one way of getting your name in the paper; no injustice can be done by supposing that was her real aim.

But it is very hard to think of any other way of doing it which would have been quite as repugnant to the instincts of decent people.





## 'DYNAMITE' SEEN IN OHIO RELIEF

New Deal Political Hazards  
Impend If Hopkins Can't  
Prove Charges

By LYLE C. WILSON  
WASHINGTON, March 19 (UPI)—  
The New Deal's political hazards are  
now apparent in Ohio where final  
judgment on the role of the federal  
emergency relief dispute rests with  
voters of that state. The case may  
decide next year's presidential  
campaign.

Federal Relief Administrator  
Harry L. Hopkins says Democratic  
leaders in Ohio are secretly  
opposing him, and down the march  
for campaign contributions. Davey  
has sworn out a warrant for arrest

but has not charged him.
