PRESSURE GAINS FOR ISSUES IN INSURANCE EVILS

Eccles' Statement Gives New Impetus to Demand for Adjustments INCOME TAX UNDER FIRE

By EDWARD W. LEWIS (WASHINGTON, 1935, United Press). Pressure for congressional action in lowering insurance tax levies and shifting income tax burden increased today.

The statement of Federal Reserve Board Governor H. C. Eccles that high taxes should be eliminated in depression periods, and treasury indication of a sharp increase in tax revenue accelerated the movement.

Despite adjustment by members of the House Banking and Currency Committee, where the legislation already originates, that pressure for adjustment was increased.

Chairman Robert L. Doughton indicated, however, some reservations may be made in the insurance tax levies to make them more equitable.

Eccles told the house banking and currency committee he believed the budget could not be balanced unless the government must continue huge emergency expenditures through the time being. It said his forecast of income tax levies only when incomes are such that they produce substantial revenues.

Irrigation District at Caldwell Stated to Receive RFC Cash Help

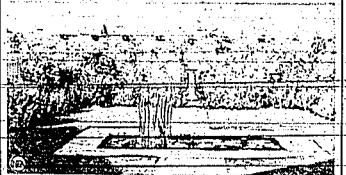

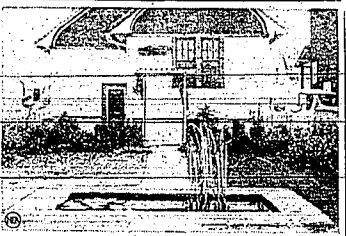
Your Garden

This is the seventh of 12 articles on gardening by specialists of the New Jersey College of Agriculture and Experiment Station at Rutgers University.

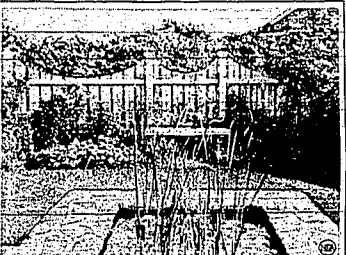

Here is an excellent example of what summer, flowers and artistic planning can do for any country. The plot is only 33 1/2 by 125 feet, it has all the elements of a harmonious arrangement for the small, artistic grounds.



This is the opposite end of the diagonal walk which defines the major axis. The terminal feature at this end, corresponding to the fountain at the other, is the house itself, although the arch serves the same purpose.



At the right angle in relation to the major axis is the minor axis, which is defined at each end by benches such as the one shown above. They are of less interest as garden features than the arch and the sun-dial, which are the terminal points of the major axis.

At the intersection of the two axes is the small, rectangular pool, with its floating pond lilies and the tall, reed-like cattails. The white fence shown in the background separates the private garden from the service or utilitarian area.

UNKNOWN SAVES CITY HUGE SUM

Anonymous Benefactor Gives Attorney Fees Worth \$4,000,000

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP)—An "unknown citizen" saved Oklahoma City \$4,000,000. The "most useful citizen" award made annually may go to the unknown person who with a scrawled note saved the city its most valuable asset—title to the city-owned land.

Several years ago city lawyers annually questioned the validity of the city's title to the strip of land which extends through the heart of Oklahoma City, and which for 40 years prior to 1930 was the stock "island" railroad's right of way.

It was traced back to 1838. In 1838 congress gave the railroad a right of way, but before the railroad started off the right of way "secret persons" had marked claim on the land when it was opened the following year. In 1902 congress passed an act providing that when a right of way is abandoned—the title shall revert to the municipality. The "unknown citizen" furnished the clue on which the suit was won.

BIG BRAIN ROBOT NEARLY FINISHED

Giant Machine at Philadelphia Will Do Complicated Kinds Of Mathematics

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Partial operation of the world's largest differential analyzer, a super-calculating machine, has been demonstrated at the Moore School of Electrical Engineering at the University of Pennsylvania.

The huge mechanical "brain" does long and weighing three tons has a "memory" somewhat similar to its human counterpart, but is able to solve problems far beyond human capacity. Work on the machine was started more than a year ago by 100 U.S.A. workers under the supervision of Irvy Travis, of the Moore School faculty. Travis designed the analyzer, using the principles followed by Dr. Vannevar Bush of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, who designed the first machine of its kind four years ago. Travis, however, has produced a much larger instrument which, when fully completed, will have two and one-half times the "mental" capacity of Dr. Bush's original machine. The machine solves problems through ingenious applications of simple physical and geometrical laws, coordinated through gears, wheels and mechanical amplifying mechanisms. After related mathematical equations have been solved, the machine memorizes the results. Other variables in the equations then can be solved, after which the machine reaches back into its "memory" to produce accurate answers, recorded in paper and completely tabulated.

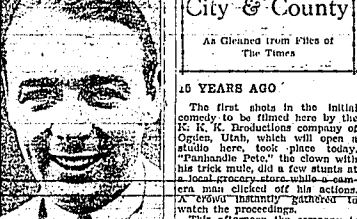

BIG BUSINESS

President Roosevelt's remarks on public utility holding companies bring into sharp relief the growing disposition to distinguish between big business and high finance.

### QUARANTINE BAN SEEN NEAR END

Idaho Expert Says Midwest Has Taken First Steps Toward Revision

MOSCOW, (Special)—Willingness of the central states quarantine board to accept in the middle western states finely-chopped alfalfa from weevil countries in Idaho under certain regulations constitutes the forerunner of a general revision of present, weevil quarantine regulations in the opinion of Dr. Ciparis Wickland, University of Idaho agricultural experiment station entomologist. Dr. Wickland expressed this opinion upon the return from the central states quarantine board meeting at Urbana, Illinois. ### LEAD ARSENATE BEST FOR MOTH

Delegates Agree On Effective Substitute Has Been Found In Parasitic War

MOSCOW, (Special)—All delegates to the national codling moth conference, now about 300, agreed that lead arsenate remains the most effective insecticide for codling moth control and that there is yet no substitute that can be recommended to take its place, according to Dr. Claude Wickland, entomologist with the university of Idaho agricultural experiment station. Dr. Wickland attended the conference, recently held at Urbana, Illinois, as one of the representatives of Idaho.

Best substitutes. The most promising substitute mentioned at the conference was calcium arsenate, zinc arsenate, cuprous cyanide, and nicotine; but the entomologists felt that more experimental work was necessary to get more facts on each. Dr. Wickland reported that operators at the conference indicated that calcium arsenate gave uniformly better results with less foliage and fruit injury in the west than in the east.

Practically all states were represented at the conference. Experiment results with less foliage and fruit injury in the west than in the east was devoted to a discussion of research which is to be undertaken this year and a discussion of the statistics derived from research records amounted to \$4,460.
