President Expects Job-Making Drive to Be Running Full Blast in Autumn

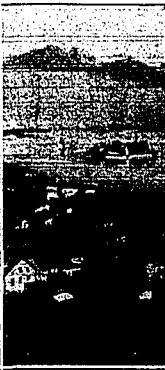

Mr. Roosevelt said there probably would be no new legislation added to the work-relief program already was going

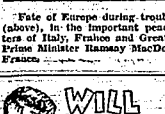

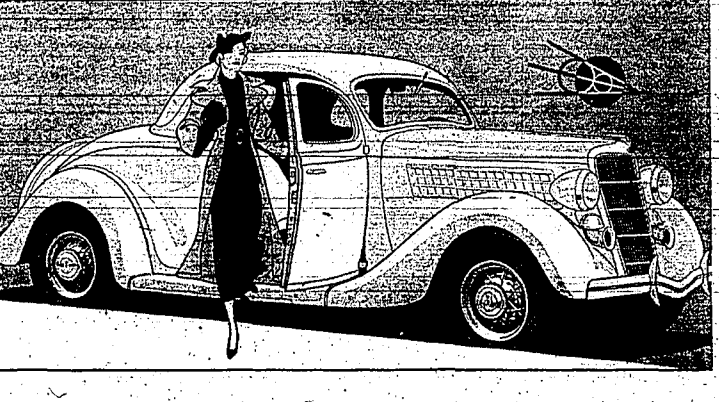

CONTRACT FOR ROME FIGHT WITH SCHMELING OFFERED BAER

DUCE SUBSIDIZES \$300,000 MATCH

Mussolini Guarantees Champ Receiving Cash for Bout On Aug. 17

NEW YORK, April 10 (Special)—The Max Baer-Schmeling heavy-weight championship fight announced yesterday by Edw. J. Walker, Rotterdam, N. Y., native Germany as head of the fight sport agency today became a fact. Baer, backed project headed for Rome, Charlie Harvey, just here from Europe, with the fight announced that the bout would be held in Italy Aug. 17.

"Mr. Mussolini," Uncle Charlie Baer said, "personally will subsidize the fight to guarantee the match. He will guarantee the terms provided for in these contracts with which I am loaded down."

"Under one contract Rotterdam will place \$100,000 in a bank of this amount's choice one month before the fight and the rest would be paid up to 10 days before the fight."

"Of the \$100,000 I will accept \$10,000 before calling for Europe and \$10,000 upon its arrival and await until after the match to collect the balance."

In either case Baer would be forced to appear in Rome, a month before the bout, if he should accept the first plan, the \$100,000 would not be posted until he arrived.

Harvey awaited a long distance call today to tell Max Baer and his manager, Axel Hoffman, men in a bargaining mood.

Harvey said it was a plain case of being fancy and not being tough, who joined up for the match for Germany but ran into the obstacle of Benji's Jewish nationality, then shifted to London as part of King George's anniversary celebration but finally had to move from there because of the heavy British tax.

All up to Baer.

"It positively is in the sack if Baer is to fight in Rome," Harvey is explained by his negotiator, Edw. J. Walker, who handled the American end of the deal without remuneration.

He has not exceeded the fact that James J. Braddock might beat Baer and thus in the next few days—but is not authorized to discuss with anybody but Baer.

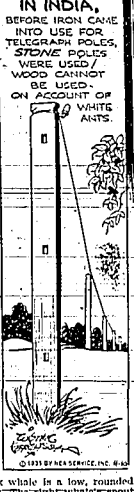
