Idaho's Crop Second Largest In History But Yield Shows Drop

IDAHO FALLS, Idaho, April 17 (AP)—The potato acreage planted for the 1934 season was the second largest in the history of Idaho, but production was lowest since 1929, as revealed in the final review of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, local representative of the U. S. department of agriculture, analyzed the situation as follows: "The total acreage planted was 104,000 acres, exceeded in 1933 by 10,000 acres and in 1934 by 10,000 acres. # EUROPE DICKERS FOR ARMS PACTS

### Unprecedented Treaties Will Bind Armies to Enforce World Peace

By RICHARD D. McMILLAN (Copyright, 1935, United Press)

PARIS, April 17 (U.P.)—A series of treaties unprecedented in world history, binding armies and air forces in a formidable combination to enforce peace, was in prospect in Europe today.

What these treaties are to mean to Europe and the world depends on Nazi Germany and the League of Nations council in meeting at Geneva.

Disarmament Pacts  
Negotiations on various schemes for making peace secure have ended. Hope of early armistice has gone. If armistice is to be limited at all they will be limited at the highest point in history: German rejection of Adolf Hitler's rejection of British, French and Italian proposals for securing peace, started the treaty makers to work.

Fierce Laval, French foreign minister, is working out at Geneva with Maxime Buzon, Italian ambassador, foreign ministers of Russia and Czechoslovakia, the first steps toward eastern European army alliances.

French-Italian Pact  
Gen. Victor Denis, French air minister, will go to Rome early in May to talk to the Italian general staff and draft a basis of the French-Italian air alliance. Despite reluctance of statesmen to admit the prospect of military alliance and air alliances, it is indicated that some of their activity may be due to reports that Germany's air force is not only superior to that of the superior to Great Britain's, with planes that can fly faster and farther.

There was no doubt that the treaty as a whole, would be made late in the year, and their ultimate fate depended on the Reich government.

Could Still Be Halted  
Convinced by the powers that Germany and her work was acting in good faith might yet admit the alliance to be authorized, in governments—minds—to non-aggression.

But the ring around Germany was in process of forging. It was revealed authoritatively that a reference in the final communiqué of the Stresemann-Sunley to the Locarno treaty to join Italy in supporting France or to admit the strength against German violation of their frontiers. It was said authoritatively that the Versailles treaty sent troops into her demilitarized zone and forfeited it, Britain would act.

BRITAIN ADVISES NAVAL MEETINGS  
Urges Individual Conferences On Limitations With Nazis And Soviet Russia

LONDON, April 17 (U.P.)—Great Britain has suggested individual conferences with Germany and Russia. It was said on reliable authority.

It was learned that Capt. Edwin Wassner, naval attaché of the German embassy, had left for Berlin to obtain his government's instructions preparatory to opening negotiations here.

A Russian spokesman said it would be premature to say Britain had formally invited Russia to naval talks.

## PWA FUNDS OVER 2-BILLION MARK

### Cash Available for 1935-36 Expected to Make Jobs For Two Million

WASHINGTON, April 17 (U.P.)—The public works administration will have almost \$2,500,000,000 available for distribution to political subdivisions to make jobs for 2,000,000 persons in 1935-1936.

PWA, in addition to the 299,000,000 construction fund in the \$4,850,000,000 work-relief resolution, will have around \$1,900,000,000 unexpended from its first appropriation, \$2,820,000,000 borrowed by FERA and an estimated \$250,000,000 from the sale of municipal bonds.

Officials said, on the basis of statistics from their original \$2,300,000,000 allotment, the money could finance work for 2,000,000 persons.

Billion Allocated  
The \$1,000,000,000 already has been allotted to states, counties and municipalities for construction and lying in the U. S. treasury credited to projects that have not yet needed it.

The \$299,000,000 owed PWA by the federal emergency relief administration was in the \$210,000,000 impounded by President Roosevelt last December 20 to use to feed the nation's hungry. The work-relief measure authorizes its return.

PWA has taken in approximately \$750,000,000 in municipal bonds collateral for its loans on self-liquidating projects. Officials estimated they could sell \$250,000,000 of the securities to investors during the next year without "dumping" them.

## Army Transport To Take Alaska Settlers North

### Inhabited by 117 families. It is planned to try out 60-acre homesteads for each new family.

WASHINGTON, April 17 (U.P.)—The army transport St. Mihiel will be pressed into service to take approximately 1,500 Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota residents to a new colony in Alaska, where they will try to make a fresh start in life. The colonists were selected from families on relief.

The St. Mihiel was placed at their disposal on request of Lieut. Administrator Harry L. Hopkins, the war department announced today. The transport is now laid up in reserve at the San Francisco army base.

The first contingent of 200 families is expected to sail from San Francisco about May 1. It will comprise about 700 persons, including 165 women and children. The second contingent will sail from Seattle on the St. Mihiel about May 15. On this voyage the transport will carry about 325 women and children.

Hopkins has announced that in addition to the settlers, approximately 400 men from transient camps will form part of the first contingent and will remain temporarily in building the new community around the village of Palmer, Alaska, on the Alaska railroad about 125 miles from Seward. The transients will return to the states late next fall.

Will Clear Land  
The 2,500-mile trek of the settlers by land and sea will end in the wooded valley of Manatunga, where the settlers will begin the task of clearing the land for truck gardening and dairying.

The livestock will be shipped by commercial vessels, together with part of the freight. Household effects, farm implements, building materials and other miscellaneous supplies will be shipped with the settlers on the St. Mihiel.
