WHEAT REFERENDUM

Wheat farmers on May 25 will go to the polls to determine the future of the wheat adjustment pro-

gram.

Five outstanding facts are to be considered, according to E. J. iddings, state director of extension, who lists these facts as follows:

who lists these facts as follows:

The first big fact is that our former large export market continues to be small. Foreign countries have placed high tariffs and quotas against our wheat. Our own tariffs against foreign goods have also made it difficult for foreign countries to huy our wheat. Every effort is being made to increase export markets, but this is a slow process.

Second, there is still enough wheat land available to produce bumper crops and surpluses. The drouth, while solving some of the immediate surplus problems, has not changed the fundamental causes of the wheat problem, which are the large potential wheat acreage, and the difficulty of reopening our export markets.

Third, is the fact that world prices continue

Third, is the fact that world prices continue at low levels. Our two short-crops have kept us on a domestic price basis, but we cannot expect a drouth every year. Unrestricted production, in the face of the world situation, would force our prices to their previous depressed position. Fourth, domestic consumption of wheat remains relatively constant. Since bread already has a large place in the diet, efforts being made to improve the quality and appeal of bakery products cannot be expected to secure any large increase in human consumption of wheat. Use of wheat for livestock feed is ordinarily increased only when wheat is cheap in relation to other crops.

Fifth, farmers are protected, through the adjustment payments on their domestic allotments, against low world export prices. If we had been on a world price basis during the last year, it is estimated that our farin prices would have been 30 to 35 cents a bushel under what they actually were.
