WHY NOT A THEATER GUILD?

Twin Falls should have a Civic Theater Guild.
Individual groups in the city regularly produce drainatic offerings of many types, both secular and religious, and the attendance at these functions is almost always gratifying. The caliber of histrionics displayed is often of a high level, and directorial ability in several instances has been almost as excellent as enthusiastic admirers claimed.

Why not a unified Little Theater group, working together as a cohesive whole and drafting only the best of dramatic talent in the city?

Twin Falls has a need for high-caliber legitimate drama, for authentic staging of the numerous Broadway hits available to Little Theater groups at moderate fees—A Civic Theater Guild might produce one such-full-length drama here every-three months; in the intervals between it—kept on the plane to which such organizations in other conveninties have adhered, a Civic Theater group in Twin Falls could very conceivably draw substantial exposus, on the legitimate merit of its offerings.

The city boasts of several falented designers capable of preparing inexpensive but effective sets for the productions. It has other talent to fill the varied needs of theatrical behind-the-stage demands.

And all of these elements, it would probably be a

And all of these elements, it would probably be found, would be glad to work together in a Civic Theater Guild as another means towards rounding out the city's cultural and social life.

The question of an outside director, with ensuing-financial-demands, usually plagues. Little Theaters. Why not alternate several of the best local dramatic directors, each handling one or more of the four suggested annual productions?

Best-site-for-staging-of-performances could be worked out by the Guild membership.

And any small profits, over and above expenses, could be applied to worthy charity as the membership saw fit.

Twin Falls needs such an enterprise, if kept on the right level. Proponents of a Civic Theater Guild would do well to call a meeting, sound out sentiment and potentialities, and start the ball rolling.






