RURAL ELECTRIC PROGRAM ADDED TO WORKS DRIVE

Power Expert, Named as Head of New Division, Starts On Set-Up

By RICHARD L. HARKNESS WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—The administration today made extension of power lines to 3,000,000 American farm homes a top priority.

Officials hoped, by spending at least \$100,000,000 for rural electrification, to supply homes with electricity by lamp and candles, a major part of its \$4,000,000,000 war program.

President Roosevelt assigned Morris L. Cooke, Philadelphia power expert, to head the new division.

Cooke, now setting up his administrative organization here, stressed the need for rural electrification.

It is not necessary, he said, to enlarge upon the benefits of electricity.

He said that it averages only 100 kilowatt hours per year per consumer.

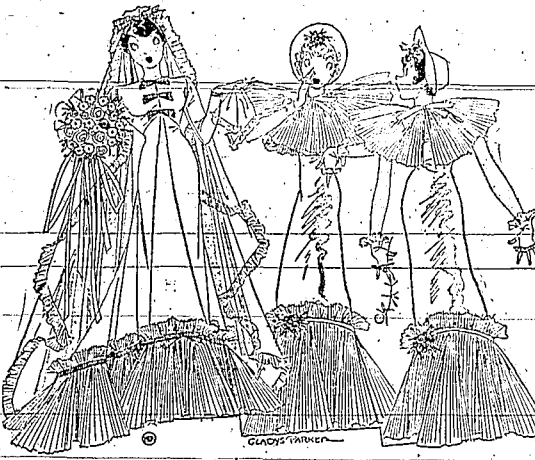

A total of 27 sections was a by a fast-ruling tournament. A test was put off one week because of heavy rains which made the 36-hole courses virtually unplayable.

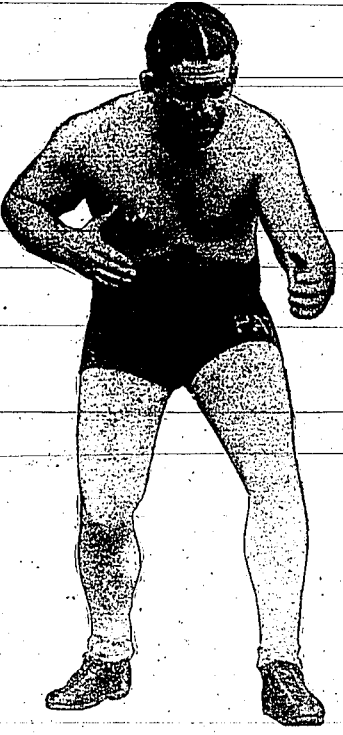

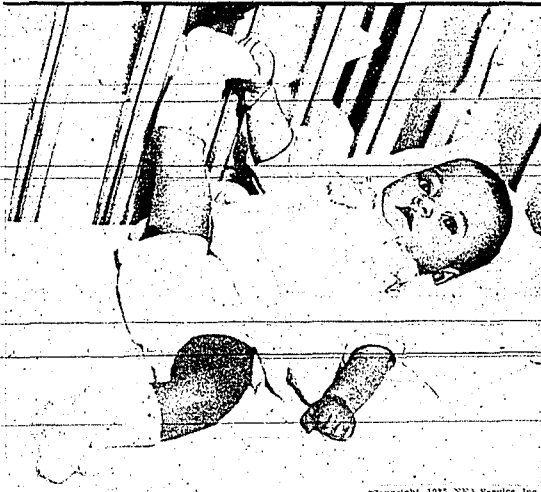
