CITIES OFFERED EASY TERMS ON WORK PROJECTS

Roosevelt Orders 45 Per Cent Grant, 55 Per Cent Loan for PWA Program

INTEREST RATE SLASHED
Liberalization Move Intended to Hasten Municipalities' Cooperation

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—President Roosevelt today offered cities an outright gift of \$400,000,000 and a loan of \$1,000,000,000 for work-relief projects.

He ruled the \$300,000,000 public work money in the \$4,000,000,000 unemployment fund should be distributed to municipalities on a 45 per cent grant and 55 per cent loan basis. He set interest rates at three per cent.

Liberalized Provisions
PWA distributed its original \$3,500,000,000 by granting only 20 per cent and loaning the other 80 per cent with certified bonds as collateral. The money drew four per cent.

The President's new program cuts the interest rate on the 80 per cent loan from 6 to 4 per cent. It also authorized the PWA to issue bonds for the new program with a 40 per cent grant and 60 per cent loan.

Such action is designed to make it easier for municipalities to borrow funds. Instead of requesting an outright all-federal grant, cities can now borrow from the federal government on a more generous basis.

WHEAT CONTROL PROGRAM

It is logical to predict that the results of the referendum on the wheat production control program being held throughout the wheat sections of the nation today, will be an overwhelming vote of approval.

Apparently the wheat crop still needs the assistance which the control program provides, for the price is low. Just what it would have been without the benefits of the AAA is difficult to imagine.

In this program, as in others, a great deal of misinformation has been spread. We hear occasionally of the government having "destroyed crops" which is not the case, and in addition it is well known that no grower is compelled to enter into the contract to restrict production unless he chooses to, and then he is compensated accordingly by processing taxes.

This county, being the largest wheat growing county in the state, has more than ordinary interest in the wheat program. It has brought on approximately \$200,000 to local growers, and that has been an important item in recovery here.

Last year the corn-hog program under the AAA brought new cash of \$75,000; sugar beets growers are receiving \$150,000 in benefit payments; cattle growers, \$9,600, and sheep raisers, \$7,400.

There are those who do not care to participate in such programs, and they are entitled to do as they choose in this regard. There are others who participate, take the money, and then are among the most severe critics of the plan.

On the whole, however, the benefits have been real and appreciated, and the recipients sincere in their approval which is expected to be recorded in no uncertain terms today.

Unexpected Difficulties Necessitated A New Start for Test

Friday, May 10th, at 10 P. M. a STEWART-WARNER REFRIGERATOR was connected to the power service through a special wattmeter. The meter and the refrigerator door was sealed by Mr. R. W. Carpenter, of the Idaho Power Co., in the presence of three contest judges. The idea of the test was to see how many watts of electrical power was consumed by the Stewart-Warner in a six weeks period.

MEDDLESOME PERSON TAMPERED WITH ORIGINAL WIRING

For an unknown reason someone jerked the wires out of the meter and interfered with the seal on the door sufficient to open the door and meddle with the controls. DUE TO THIS TROUBLE THE REFRIGERATOR HAD TO BE RECONNECTED THROUGH A PLENTIFUL CABLE AND THE METER ENGAGED IN A STEEL BOX. New arrangements had to be made to seal the door shut, seal a screen over the mechanism compartment, etc. It now appears to be tamper proof and uninterrupted service through the test seems to be assured. The meter was reset to zero and connected electrically at 10 P. M. May 17th by an employee of the Idaho Power company in the presence of witnesses. Temperature controls were set to maintain a temperature below 40 degrees. This new start of the test made possible just one week to the hour after the original start. THIS WILL SHORTEN THE OPERATING TIME OF THE TEST JUST ONE WEEK, making a six weeks test instead of the original six week test. Those submitting estimates with a six week test in mind, will be allowed to submit a new estimate.

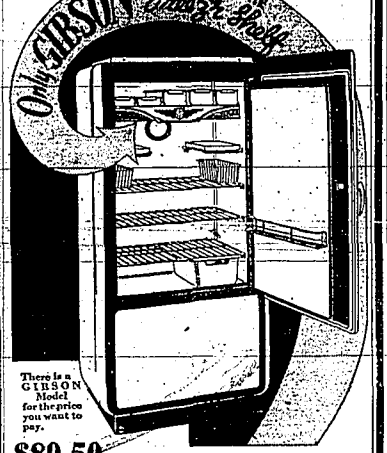
