PHILIPPINE TANGLE Something that deserves that over-worked title, "epoch-making," seems to be happening on the other side of the Pacific ocean these days, and we are not giving it quite as much thought as it deserves. The Philippines are in the process of gaining their freedom. They are gotting it pacefully, without bloodshed, because the power which has ruled them for a generation is getting out voluntarily. History contains no precedent for such action. The 10-year independence plan seems to have won Philippine approval by an overwhelming vote. There remains, then, only the task of getting through the transition period as well as possible.
