CLEARING SKIES CHEER MIDWEST

Flood and Storm Area Hopes For Normal Weather to End Disasters

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 19 (AP) - Clearing skies today gave hope of return to normal weather in three states of the midwest which since Memorial day have had areas of lives to flood and hurricanes.

Property damage in excess of \$35,000,000 was partly offset by improved crop condition after two years of drought and dust in Nebraska, Oklahoma and Texas.

In Nebraska residents of the Republican river valley were recovering from the second flood in as many weeks. The death toll from both disasters stood at 84. More than 700 were on relief rolls.

Vaccine Rushed Red Cross officials rushed vaccine from Lincoln to Beatlemin, Neb., to check spread of a small-pox and typhoid fever epidemic.

Coroners added to property damage in Oklahoma and Texas. At Stephenville, Tex., J. R. Ellis, 76, died of injuries received when his home collapsed during a wind storm Tuesday night. The death list from drowning in swollen streams now receding stood at 20.

Highway damage was estimated at \$2,000,000. The municipal power and light plant at Austin was virtually wrecked by high water and properly valued at \$1,500,000 destroyed.

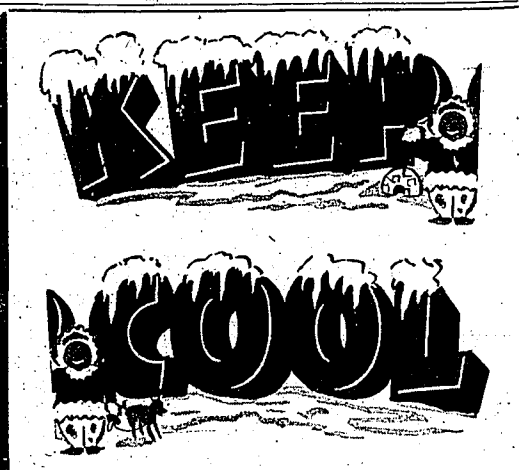
DEATH SUMMONS FORMER EDENITE
