NEGRO FAVORITE OVER EX-CHAMP

Detroit Slugger Holds Slight Betting Edge for Match Tuesday Night

NEW YORK, June 21 (AP)—The betting for Joe Louis, Detroit's debut test, Negro puncher, comes tomorrow night in a match which many believe will be the greatest in the history of the sport. The 250-pound Hallmark Carnera, a 15-round heavyweight, will meet a challenger who is expected to pull approximately \$500,000 to see Louis attempt a sensational fight in the ex-heavyweight champion's plant frame. It will be the first fight of the year, paying twice the receipts of the fight between James J. Braddock and Louis.

Louis' Fight Favorite
Louis will enter the ring with the betting going in his favor, but after the experience of the Braddock upset it is likely even money will prevail by tomorrow.

Never pulling a punch, Louis has given his sparring partners an unmerciful hammer during his long career of training at Pompton Lakes, N. J. His punches have floored every one of them and made several quit.

Although Carnera has a record of 52 knockouts in 85 bouts, he is regarded as a stiff puncher, but he has a club-like left but he never has shown a dangerous punch since he was the 145-pounder.

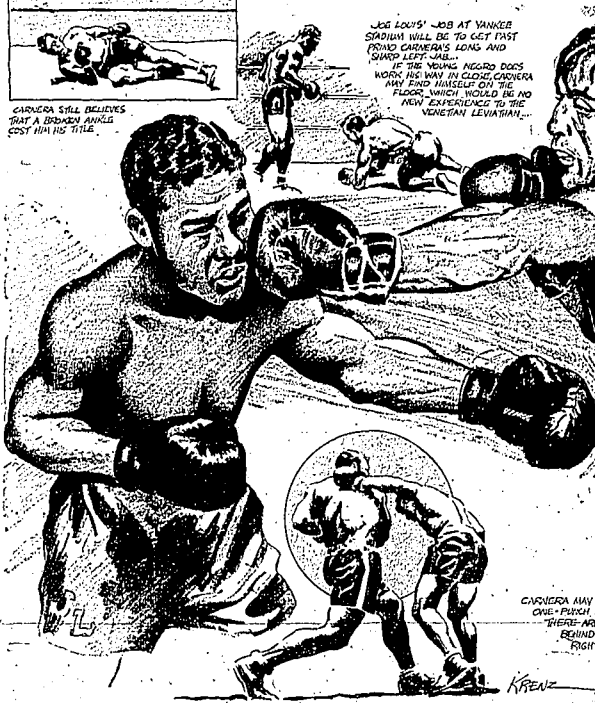

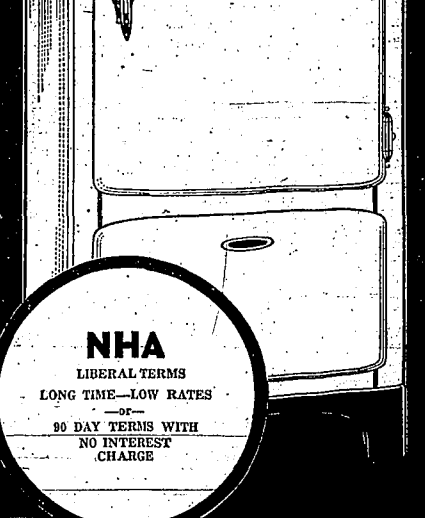
