This being the season when hopeful young college graduates step down from the rostrum and look timorously out at a cold and faintly hostile world; it is-worth-while-to-sec\_lust\_what they-are\_getting\_in-the way of farewell-advice-from-their-mentors.
The ring of the bacefaliarets sermon and the commencement address is abroad in the land again. If we listen carefully, we can get at least a cross-section of the ideas of our educators—and if the cross-

if we listen carefully, we can get at least a cross-section of the ideas of our educators—and if the cross-section lacks unity, it is none the less interesting for that.

Dr. Harold W. Dodds, president of Princeton, warns Princeton seniors that boredom is a greater danger than the fast tempo of modern life, while Cornell's seniors are told by Dr. Julius Bixler of Harvard that "a change in the direction of some form of collectivism" seems to be on the horizon.




