Woman, 82, Dies as Third Victim of Mad Murderer at Ogden

Intermountain Region Hunted for
Fugitive Salesman Wanted
In Berserk Killings

OGDEN, Utah, July 1 (UPI)—Mrs. Emma Scott Rose, 82, died at Deseret Memorial hospital today, third victim of a mad club slayer's frenzy.

Mrs. Rose suffered a skull fracture and other severe injuries when George E. Stevenson, 37-year-old Salt Lake City cosmetics salesman, who is the grandfather's husband, went berserk yesterday with a pitch handle, fatally injuring Adam Snyder, 62, and Mrs. Mabel Snyder, 62.

Mortensen also inflicted severe injury upon his wife, Grace Snyder Mortensen, 25. Hospital attendants reported the woman still in serious condition today, unchanged from yesterday.

Police searching the intermountain area for traces of the fugitive salesmen said the frenzy was induced by drink and by domestic difficulties which led to the killing of his wife and to the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Snyder.

State troopers said the killing widened the scope of their hunt for Mortensen, Police Sergeant L. M. Moore, a state trooper, complained for the man, charging him specifically with the slaying of Mrs. Snyder.

Possibility that he may have been the victim in his automobile was exploded when it was wrecked in a garage where it had been since an accident a week or so ago.

World Wheat Supply
Lowest in Nine Years

Caryoyer in United States Estimated at

Smallest Since July 1, 1928

WASHINGTON, July 1 (UPI)—In the midst of a drought which has ravaged the northwest spring wheat section, the bureau of economic research reported today that the world wheat supply on

July 1 will be the smallest since 1928.

The bureau estimated that the

July 1 wheat carryover—in the

peel, and noted that "continued unfavorable conditions" will again necessitate hard wheat and durum imports.

The bureau said the rapid deterioration

of the crop in the spring wheat

area, now appears likely that

the world wheat supply in 1936 and 1937 may be approximately as

high relative to world prices as

KILLER LOSES IN
CLEMENCY FIGHT

Lab Board Turns Down Plea
For Delbert Green, Due
To Die July 10

BALTIMORE CITY, July 1 (UPI)—The condemned man, 30, who had lost his life to be expected to die this morning, was to die today when the state prison July 10 will go forward as ordered by Judge Eugene C. Stenger, who denied a possible appeal to the U.S. supreme court.

A REAL FOURTH OF JULY

There is something appealing about the way this country proposes to publicly commemorate Independence day this year.

It's not a one-town affair, but a joint celebration taken part in by all the towns and communities at the county fairgrounds at Piner.

No doubt this will be but the signal for similar celebrations in the future, but regardless, one will tend to cement relationships, prove that it can be done, and in addition, draw a monster program which should make this year's commemorative Fourth of July event outstanding in local annals.

Real interest and effort have been put forth by the committee upon whom responsibility for the celebration details have fallen and for this they are earning praise and appreciation.

Parents will do well to take advantage of the several opportunities offered throughout south central Idaho to take their families to patriotic celebrations this year. There are many real values to children as well as adults in passing from daily affairs and from customary holiday pastimes to imbue the patriotic spirit of the gallant occasion and spend the day commemorating the anniversary of American Independence.

A program calculated to appeal to all is being arranged for residents of this county, and everyone is invited. Other communities in the area are celebrating similarly, and they, too, have appealing attractions for visitors.

No one can complain that there is no place to go in south central Idaho on the approaching Fourth of July. The entertainment is being provided for the public in general, and the response should be just as large as the welcome is generous and whole-hearted.

CONSTITUTION AND "DICTATORSHIP"

One of the hallmarks of the average pollywog is that he has an incurable tendency to get the cart before the horse.

Someone in the Democratic camp seems to have accomplished this enterprising feat by proposing, in the final flurry of preconvention confusion, that the party go on record against dictatorship by plunking for a constitutional amendment to limit a president to one term of six years.

This is not a new proposal. It has been kicked around, at odd moments, for a good many years, and in its varied life, it has had some distinguished sponsors. But that it should be suggested as the one great, final and fool-proof defense against the chance of dictatorship only shows that someone has been doing his figuring backward.

The idea apparently is that it's a designing, ambitious and unscrupulous man finds himself limited by law to one term in the White House will straightway abandon any idea he may have had of making his tenure permanent, how to the will of the people, step out gracefully when his time is ripe.

But—if the constitution will stop a would-be dictator why put in a six-year clause? There is plenty in the constitution as it stands, to head off a dictatorship, once you assume that the dictator is going to let himself be bound by the constitution.

The defense against dictatorship is not as simple as that. If we were, could rest in the assurance of complete democracy to the end of time by the simple expedient of putting a couple of iron-clad paragraphs in the constitution, shoving it back on the ice and then forgetting it.

Unfortunately, there is more to it. The preservation of democracy and freedom rests on a complex and intangible structure of which the constitution is only the visible out-

ward expression.

It rests upon the sturdy independence of the average American, upon his age-old hatred of interference and oppression, upon his insistence that he is his own boss; upon his vigilance to see that his rights are preserved, his readiness to jump up and squawk when those rights are infringed; upon the native intelligence which enables him to snuff out the self-seeker and the autocrat.

These are things which can't be embodied in any law. They are the things which have made our democracy work, have brought it through great crises and have insured us against going the way of Italy and Germany. As long as they last, no one need fear an American dictatorship.

Any party that really wants to protect us from dictatorship might think about how it can preserve and foster those qualities and forget about any added safeguard in the constitution.
