THE BRUNEAU
 Prospects of development of the great BrunEAU tract to the west as revealed at Boise with the filing of incorporation papers by the Twin Falls Extension Company of Idaho may spell much for the Gen. State.

With recurrence of drought conditions in the middle west there is much to be gained if such tracts by those in the affected area. Many farmers, discouraged by years of futile combat with the elements, should be seeking to carve new fomes for themselves in the west. Should reclamation-of-the-BrunEAU-project-be undertaken soon it is, of course, true that considerable time must elapse before the project would be open to settlement, but it becomes manifest, that this reclamation project, in the years to come will offer opportunities for those unwilling to face the uncertainties of middlewestern farming where the ravages of drought cannot be overcome.

There is no region such as the BrunEAU project, anywhere made as wonderful a country as that known as the great Twin Falls project. All that is required is water, and that can be harnessed.

There may be considerable expense involved in bringing the water to the land, but the formation of the tract, the fertility of the soil, the project's location, availability and proximity to this tract make its future seem to appear certain.

Years of endless effort have been consumed in an attempt to bring this vast area under irrigation. Persistence has been the guiding spirit of these present-day reclamationists, just as the same qualification which brought about the settlement of this tract.

There will be consuming interest in the progress made on the BrunEAU mid-slope hope that the project plan will not miscarry, that a real start has been made on the dream of empire to the west and that in no distant future the BrunEAU irrigated project will take its place along with the several other successful developments in Idaho.

"WHOLESAOME CHANGE"

Of course, Mr. Cummings takes pride in the accomplishments of the G-men. He is glad that they have been able to "deal with the criminal operations of individuals and gangs whose activities had made American justice a subject of wonder to the rest of the world."

And here the attorney general strikes a vital point. The "wholesome change" in the public's attitude certainly can be attributed largely to this new achievement in law enforcement that the G-men have brought us.

If we glorify the officer instead of the gangster, it is because justice has been delivered, as we have a right to expect it to deliver in America.

NO ROOM IN NEW-YORK

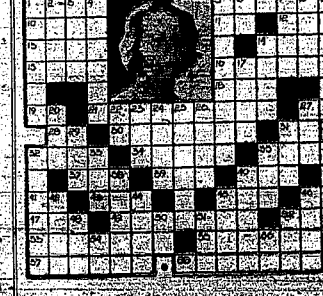

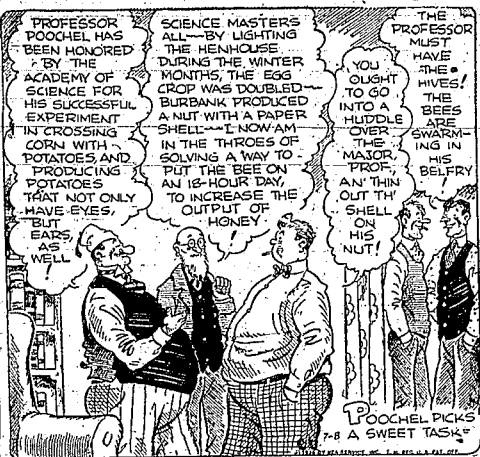

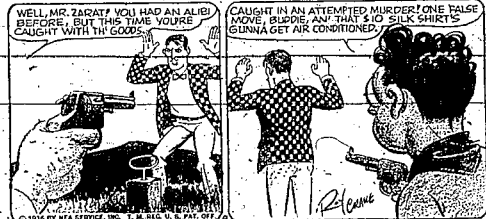
