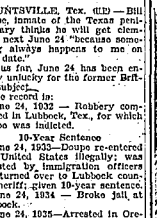

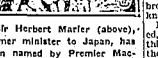

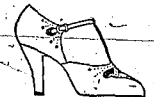

HUNGER CLAIMED FATIGUE'S BASIS

Scientists Declare Old Outburst Of Three-Meal Maximum Isn't Correct

By H. H. STEINBURNER
 NEW HAVEN, Conn., (AP)—"Three meals a day, it is said, is the best thing for you. If you don't eat three meals a day, you will get fatigued and you will get hungry. You will get tired and you will get old. You will get sick and you will get dead." This is the old slogan of the three-meal maximum. But a new study by scientists at Yale University has shown that this is not correct. The study, which was conducted by Dr. Howard Haggren, Dr. J. H. Green, and Dr. J. H. Green, of the department of applied physiology at Yale, according to their studies, too much emphasis has been placed on the quantity of food eaten and not on the time intervals at which it is eaten.

Old Custom
 Three meals a day, or eating three times a day, is a hard and fast dietary maxim in America. It is taught to growing children, to factory workers, farmers, professional men, middle-aged adults, and whenever anyone breaks it with a whiff of sympathy, he is usually called a glutton.

System in American
 Yet the custom of three meals a day is almost strictly American. In other countries, the regular habit is to eat four or five meals a day. In Germany, the regular habit is to eat four or five meals a day, as well as afternoon tea, and a milk on the pantry before retiring.

While such practices are not unusual in the United States, general attitude seems to favor just three meals. It is believed that a large group of people, when hungry, get the appetite to eat, but the hunger that everyone should merit the digestive ability to eat. The investigators of Yale University biologists refute all these ideas.

TOWN ORGANIZES LABOR ARBITERS

Centrals, Ill., Has Board to 'Settle Disputes and End Strike Menace'

CENTRALIA, Ill., (U.P.) — The principle of state and national labor relations boards has been reduced to its simplest form here to provide this city of 15,000 with a means of quickly settling labor disputes.

At the suggestion of A. C. Schuller, president of the Centralia Harbors' union and other labor officials, a board of conciliation composed of business men and members of union labor was organized to hear all controversies between labor and business.

Labor and business are represented equally by four members each. Schuller, the father of the plan, was elected chairman. Another member of the board, whose roles played an old member who may represent either business or labor.

Favored By Merchants

Business men are expected to wholeheartedly in favor of the plan.

Verne Joy, newspaper publisher, described the board as a means for "closer understanding of the problems of labor and business by both sides." O. G. Owen, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, is equally enthusiastic.

Fourteen of the city's 16 unions to which the plan was submitted approved it. The others are expected to concur at a later meeting.

Labour's Support Claimed

Ralph C. May, a labor representative on the board, said he believed the "union men of Centralia are 95 per cent in favor of this plan."

The board was formed as a permanent organization and is to settle all disputes. It will provide, however, that settlement must not conflict with rules and regulations of the American Federation of Labor.

Centralia is located 70 miles east of St. Louis. It is served by four railroads and its outskirts are two coal mines. Two roads, the Illinois Central and the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy, maintain shops in the town.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

KEEP BIDDING LOW

This is the second of a series of four articles based upon less known, but fundamental, bidding situations discussed by Charles H. Goren, of Philadelphia, in his new book, "Winning Bridge Made Easy." The questions are so vital and the manner of their presentation is so clear, that I feel my readers will be interested in knowing about them.

One Over One Responses

When your partner has opened the bidding with one of a suit, you may keep the bidding open or you may be able to do so at the level of one.

To state it another way: If you open the bidding with one diamond and your partner bids one spade with one heart, he does not promise any more strength than a bid of one no trump. The rule of modern bidding is that you should not respond with one spade or one heart with one no trump if you can possibly bid one of a suit. In this case can be made even stronger. It can be extended to include suits that are not quite biddable. Thus, should you hold:

♠ K1005
♥ 76
♦ Q713
♣ 974 5-2

the best response is one spade, and not one no trump.

The spade response still permits your partner to bid one no trump, which you bid one no trump your side may be prevented from playing the hand at spades, if that should happen to be the best contract.
