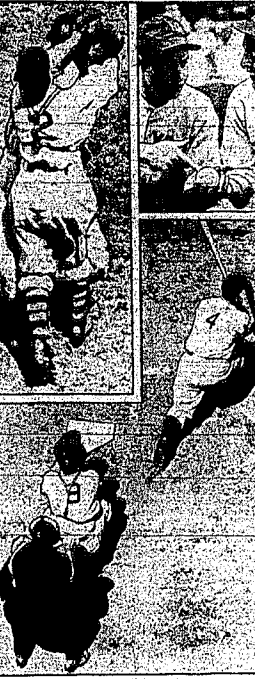

FILING DATE CLOSURE Today will see the close of the filing period for candidates in the primary election.

Just what the last-minute developments may be cannot well be foretold, but it appears that there is a healthy interest in the campaign and that no office will suffer by lack of candidates.

With the entry list all completed today, Monday will see the opening of a brisk 30-day campaign to choose congressional, state, judicial, county and precinct nominees.

In Idaho the primary of each party is conducted separately with electors being able to vote only in one primary. Each must decide in advance whether he is going to vote for Democrats or for Republicans—he cannot vote for both on Aug. 11. Then the choices of the voters of the respective parties are pitted against each other in the general election on November 9.

There will be rivalry in this primary election campaign, but there need be nothing else. For the most part during the next 30 days, the fight will be interspersed with contests for several state, as well as county places. It's up to the Democrats to pick their ticket, and the same thing applies to the Republicans. The primary race is open to everyone and those chosen, it is certain, will have received their nominations at the hands of the voters—not at the hands of a caucus.

All persons should be interested in their government and in their public officials. They should follow the campaign closely so as to be informed on the candidates, and then vote their convictions at their party primaries next Aug. 11.

The other countries managed to miss that fate—but they didn't miss it by very much. Only by reading the detailed histories of that period can one realize how frightfully close the best of Europe came to following the same path.

Why did that happen? Why did the most populous nation in Europe suddenly revert to the savagery, the confusion, the pain, and the hunger of the Dark Ages, so that the deaths of its people in the reconstruction period had to be numbered in the millions?

The answer is inescapable. The war made the Russians desperate; it gave them the terrible feeling that no change could possibly be for the worse, that their rulers had been guilty of folly so stupendous that they and all they stood for had to be abolished, no matter what the cost.

Mr. Baldwin is not being unduly pessimistic in suspecting that another great war would make the people of all warring nations feel the same way. And if they do—if the plain men and women of Italy and Germany and France ever get into the state of mind the Russians got into in the final year of the war—then we shall witness anarchy, bloodshed, and cruelty on a scale that the earth has never known before.

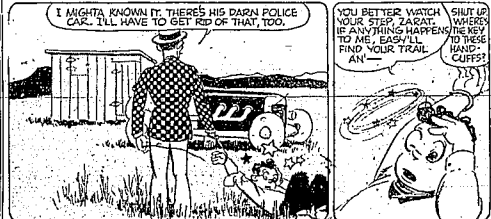
