FINANCIAL SCRAMBLE PRECEDES SAILING OF OLYMPIC TEAM

Most of Squads Help Pay Costs Ship Leaving Wednesday With Cream of Athletes

NEW YORK, July 11 (UP)—When the S. S. Manhattan sails into the harbor and sails for Hamburg on the morning she will carry an American Olympic team which is the largest financially, strongest athletically and strongest locally financially, in history.

There will be upwards of 381 athletes on board—some 50 more than made the trip to Amsterdam in 1928, when the depression still was to be waning.

Of the 32 teams which will sail, the members of only eight of them will walk up the gangplank with medals which did not cost them something out of their own pockets.

Early today it was learned that the frantic appeals had been made to the U. S. Olympic committee, and that only three teams—women's swimming, women's basketball and field hockey—were in danger of having to prune their lists.

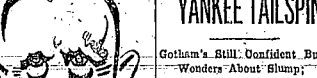
The women swimmers must raise \$5,000 today (the deadline is 11 o'clock) and the field hockey team must raise \$2,000 by the same time.

All-ages sports were in fairly good condition. The men's swimming team raised \$15,000 from the water polo and diving teams. The men's basketball team raised \$15,000 from the swimming trials.

The men and women gymnastic teams were "over the top," as were the freestyle, diving, water polo, handball, wrestling, and pistol teams, but only the men's basketball team carried over into their pockets and paid most of their own expenses.

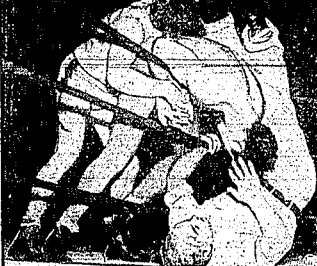
