### New Torrid Wave Nears In Midwest

### Great Lakes Regions Given Temporary Respite

CHICAGO, July 15 (UP)—Chillier air from the Hudson bay area and westerly currents brought temporary relief from an unprecedented heat wave in the Great Lakes area today but the practitioners advised again, unless a blazing sun.

Deaths attributed to the heat amounted to more than 3,000 with property damage past the \$50,000,000 mark.

Showers over Wisconsin, Minnesota, northern Iowa and Missouri "didn't do much good except in local areas," Forecaster Joseph H. Lloyd of the Chicago weather bureau reported.

"The heat wave and the drought are not definitely broken," Lloyd said. "A hot south wind again is blowing over the Midwest today. Lloyd's disconcerting forecast was substantiated by air reports which showed no signs of a major respite in the country.

The cool front bogged down at North Platte, Neb., where the temperature was in the 70s and 80s, with green and rising, the pilots reported. Choppers and planes at a reading of 60 degrees, marked the eastern edge of the cool area.

They reported bright skies over the entire area between Salt Lake City and Chicago.

Moves Into Ohio  
Lloyd said the cool air from a Hudson bay high center had overspread the Great Lakes region today and may move into the Ohio valley. The same high pressure area brought cooler weather to New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Additional reported showers are forecast for Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Kentucky and Oklahoma.

A heavy rain early today in central Illinois was accompanied by local windstorms. Falling trees wrecked telephones and power lines at Clinton, isolating the city for several hours.

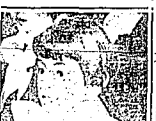
